2.5 hours of the total 24-hour requirement must include 1.0 hour of instruction on ethics, 1.0 hour of instruction on professionalism, and .50 hour of instruction on substance abuse.	Gov. Bar R. <i>Annual Registration with Commission on Continuing Legal Education</i>			
Acting Judges must register annually with the Commission on Continuing Legal Education and shall note their appointment as acting judge on the final reporting transcript.	Gov. Bar R.
