

**MAGISTRATE APPOINTMENT PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 2019**

Effective January 1, 2019, the CLE requirements increase to a total of 40 hours for magistrates. The below chart shows the requirement based on the magistrate last name and appointment date for the biennial compliance period.
