#### THE OHIO SPECIALIZED DOCKETS PRACTITIONER NETWORK

With over 100 specialized dockets in operation throughout Ohio, the Supreme Court of Ohio, the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services and the Ohio Department of Mental Health have recognized the need for interaction among the professionals that staff these courts. #### CASA HONORS LOCAL JUDGE

#### OHIO SUPREME COURT JUSTICE PUSHES FOR MENTAL HEALTH DOCKETS

#### COURT BUILDING NOW ALSO HOUSES MENTAL HEALTH CLINIC

In response to judges who say they see too many people in their courtrooms because of undiagnosed mental disorders, D.C. Mayor Adrian M. Fenty cut the ribbon to an urgent-care clinic at the D.C. Superior Court building yesterday. The D.C. Department of Mental Health, in partnership with the D.C. Superior Court and the Psychiatric Institute of Washington, obtained a \$1.5 million grant to open the facility in June, and since then 146 people have been treated, officials said. More...

# EXPLORING THE KEY COMPONENTS OF DRUG COURTS: A COMPARATIVE STUDY OF 18 ADULT DRUG COURTS ON PRACTICES, OUTCOMES, AND COSTS

This study explored how various drug court programs were implementing the "10 Key Components" that all drug courts should share as benchmarks for performance. The analysis found that drug courts exercise a significant degree of discretion in how they implement the 10 key components. For each of the 10 components, there were both similarities and differences in how drug courts were operated. Variation in how various components are designed and implemented is not a negative finding in itself, since differences across drug courts are expected as each program tailors its components to meet the needs of the population served. Still, the identification of any variation in practice within a key component is helpful, since it may explain why some drug courts are more effective than others. This report lists promising practices related to reduced costs and lower recidivism. The evaluation, conducted between 2000 and 2006, involved 18 adult drug courts from jurisdictions across the United States, with attention to process, outcome, and cost variables.
