With over 125 specialized dockets in operation throughout Ohio, the Supreme Court of Ohio, the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services and the Ohio Department of Mental Health have recognized the need for interaction among the professionals that staff these courts. In order to provide such a forum, the Ohio Specialized Docket Practitioner Network was created to provide peer support and technical assistance to these programs. The Network is comprised of several sub-networks that meet by discipline. These sub-network meetings allow specialized docket practitioners to discuss the challenges and successes they have faced in their specific role on the specialized docket court team. STATE OFFICIALS: COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS IS A CHEAPER, MORE EFFECTIVE OPTION THAN PRISON

Lucretia McCalister started using drugs when she was 33 years old. Her drug addiction became so bad that she stole money from a company that she helped manage. Although the Painesville woman paid back the money and her theft charge eventually was dismissed, she spent time in jail. At the end of her sentence, she saw herself going back to the old life that led to her addiction in the first place. McCalister's journey to recovery is one of the reasons Ohio is looking to reduce spending on state prisons and funnel that money toward community corrections, which many officials believe to be a more successful option. A SEPARATE PEACE: WHY VETERANS DESERVE SPECIAL COURTS

The problem is hardly a new one, but we need only watch *The Hurt Locker* to refresh our collective memory: veterans return from war, having seen and survived unspeakable things then try to adjust to civilian life with inadequate resources and support. Depending on the study you read, between 20 and 50 percent of veterans from the Iraq and Afghanistan wars suffer from posttraumatic stress and other mental disorders—and half don't seek mental-health care. **More...**

FUNDING

SAMSHA—GRANTS TO EXPAND SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT CAPACITY FOR ADULT DRUG COURTS

Deadline: March 16, 2010

The purpose of this program is to expand and/or enhance substance abuse treatment services in "problem solving" courts which use the treatment drug court model in order to provide alcohol and drug treatment, recovery support services supporting substance abuse treatment, screening, assessment, case management, and program coordination to adult defendants/offenders. OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS - SECOND CHANCE MENTORING PROGRAM

The Second Chance Act authorizes mentoring grants for nonprofit organizations and federally recognized Indian tribes. Project initiatives include mentoring adult offenders and offering transitional or other services to promote the safe and successful reintegration of formerly incarcerated individuals back into the community.

FY 2010 JUSTICE AND MENTAL HEALTH COLLABORATION PROGRAM GRANTS DEADLINE: April 8, 2010, at 8:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time

The U.S. Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) has released its fiscal year 2010 solicitation for <u>Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program (JMHCP)</u> grant applications. The program was authorized by the Mentally Ill Offender Treatment and Crime Reduction Act of 2004 (<u>MIOTCRA</u>) and promotes coordination among criminal justice, juvenile justice, mental health, and substance abuse agencies.

<u>Visit the BJA website to download the applicant eligibility requirements, instructions on registering for the online grant application system, and other application materials.</u>

Applicants should demonstrate a commitment to increasing public safety through innovative cross-system collaborations that improve responses to people with mental illnesses who come into contact with the criminal justice system. Eligible applicants are states, units of local government, American Indian tribes, and tribal organizations.

Three types of grants are available under this program:

- Planning (\$50,000 maximum award for 12 months)
- Planning and Implementation (\$250,000 maximum award for 30 months)
- Implementation and Expansion (\$200,000 maximum award for 24 months)

The Council of State Governments Justice Center, coordinator of the <u>Criminal Justice/Mental Health</u> <u>Consensus Project</u>, has provided technical assistance on behalf of BJA for the JMHCP since 2006.

The Consensus Project website features information on the program and MIOTCRA, including snapshots of past grantees, frequently asked questions, and a toolkit of resources that can be used to inform 2010 applications.

BUILD-A-BEAR WORKSHOP GIVING PROGRAMS TO FUND CHILDREN'S HEALTH & WELLNESS; APPLICATION DEADLINE VARIES

Build-A-Bear Workshop, Inc. awards Children's Health & Wellness Champ-A-Champion Fur Kids grants twice annually to provide direct support for children in the areas of health and wellness. Grantees include childhood disease research foundations, child safety organizations, and organizations that serve children with special needs. Application deadlines are at the end of April, July, and October. Organizations seeking unrestricted support for children are also encouraged to apply for grants through the nonprofit Build-A-Bear Workshop Foundation. The foundation reviews grant applications on a rolling basis. Grants range between \$1,000 and \$10,000 each.

OJJDP SEEKS INFORMATION ON DSO PROMISING PRACTICES

The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) seeks information on initiatives that help states achieve or maintain the deinstitutionalization of status offenders (DSO). To that end, OJJDP invites state agencies and others to <u>nominate</u> programs and strategies that have shown promise in keeping status offenders out of jail or removing status offenders from juvenile or adult detention, regardless of funding source.

Nominated programs will be reviewed for inclusion in a database of promising DSO initiatives. To be eligible for nomination, programs and strategies must have been in operation for at least 2 years and data documenting their impact must show improvement over one or more periods of time.
