ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

This cause came on for further consideration upon the filing of an application for reinstatement by respondent, Nicholas L. Gerren, Jr., Attorney Registration Number 0032341, last known business address in Vandalia, Ohio.

The court coming now to consider its order of September 13, 2006, wherein the court, pursuant to Gov.Bar R. V(6)(B)(3), suspended respondent for a period of eighteen months with the last six months stayed on conditions and ordered that, upon reinstatement, respondent would serve a six-month monitored probation, finds that respondent has substantially complied with that order and with the provisions of Gov.Bar R. V(10)(A). Therefore,

It is ordered by the court that the final six months of respondent's suspension is stayed and that he is placed on probation for a period of six months and shall be monitored by a licensed attorney to help him manage his office practices during the term of probation in accordance with Gov.Bar R. V(9) and consistent with the opinion rendered herein on September 13, 2006. It is further ordered that if respondent violates these conditions, the stay will be lifted and respondent will serve the entire term of the actual suspension.

It is further ordered that on or before thirty days from the date of this order, relator shall file the name of an attorney who will monitor respondent during the probation. It is further ordered that at the end of the probationary period, relator file a report with this court indicating whether respondent has complied with the terms of probation including monitoring.

It is further ordered that at the end of the probationary period respondent may apply for termination of probation. It is further ordered that respondent's probation will not be terminated until (1) respondent files an application for termination of probation in accordance with Gov.Bar R. V(9)(D); (2) relator files a report with the clerk of the Supreme Court indicating that respondent has complied with the terms and conditions of probation during the probationary period; (3) respondent complies with this order and all other orders issued by this Court; (4) respondent complies with the Rules for the Government of the Bar of Ohio; and (5) this court issues an order terminating respondent's probation.

It is further ordered that the clerk of this court issue certified copies of this order as provided for in Gov.Bar R. V(8)(D)(1), that publication be made as provided for in Gov.Bar R. V(8)(D)(2), and that respondent bear the costs of publication.
