## ORDER

The Board of Commissioners on Grievances and Discipline filed its final report in this court on December 9, 2010, recommending that pursuant to Rule V(6)(B)(3) of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar of Ohio the respondent, William Eric Minamyner, be suspended from the practice of law for a period of two years with eighteen months stayed on conditions. Respondent filed objections to said final report, relator filed an answer, and this cause was considered by the court.

On consideration thereof, it is ordered and adjudged by this court that pursuant to Gov.Bar R. V(6)(B)(3) and consistent with the opinion rendered herein, respondent, William Eric Minamyner, Attorney Registration Number 0015677, last known business address in Loveland, Ohio, be suspended from the practice of law for a period of one year, all stayed on the conditions that respondent: 1) serve one year of probation to be supervised by a monitor appointed by relator in accordance with Gov.Bar R.V(9), 2) limit his practice to domestic relations, general litigation, and labor law (a condition imposed at his own request), 3) continue to follow the recommendations of his treating professionals, including ongoing pharmacological management by his treating physician, and 4) commit no further misconduct. It is further ordered that if respondent fails to comply with these conditions, the stay will be lifted, and respondent will serve the entire one-year suspension.

It is further ordered that on or before 30 days from the date of this order, relator shall file the name of an attorney who will monitor respondent during the probation. It is further ordered that at the end of the probationary period, relator shall file a report with this court indicating whether respondent has complied with the terms of probation including monitoring.

It is further ordered that respondent be taxed the costs of these proceedings in the amount of \$3,964.09, which costs shall be payable to this court by cashier's check or money order on or before 90 days from the date of this order. It is further ordered that if these costs are not paid in full on or before 90 days from the date of this order, interest at the rate of 10% per annum shall accrue as of 90 days from the date of this order and the matter may be referred to the Attorney General for collection. Respondent may be held in contempt and suspended until costs and all accrued interest, are paid in full.

It is further ordered, sua sponte, by the court, that within 90 days of the date of this order, respondent shall reimburse any amounts that have been awarded against the respondent by the Clients' Security Fund pursuant to Gov.Bar R. VIII(7)(F). It is further ordered, sua sponte, by the court that if, after the date of this order, the Clients' Security Fund awards any amount against

the respondent pursuant to Gov.Bar R. VIII(7)(F), the respondent shall reimburse that amount to the Clients' Security Fund within 90 days of the notice of such award.


It is further ordered that at the end of the probationary period respondent may apply for termination of probation. It is further ordered that respondent's probation will not be terminated until: 1) respondent files an application for termination of probation in accordance with Gov.Bar R. V(9)(D), 2) relator files a report with the clerk of the Supreme Court indicating that respondent has complied with the terms and conditions of probation during the probationary period, 3) respondent complies with this order and all other orders issued by this Court, 4) respondent complies with the Rules for the Government of the Bar of Ohio, and 5) this court issues an order terminating respondent's probation.

It is further ordered that respondent shall keep the Clerk, the Butler County Bar Association, and the Disciplinary Counsel advised of any change of address where respondent may receive communications.

It is further ordered, sua sponte, that all documents filed with this court in this case shall meet the filing requirements set forth in the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court of Ohio, including requirements as to form, number, and timeliness of filings. All case documents are subject to Rules 44 through 47 of the Rules of Superintendence for the Courts of Ohio which govern access to court records.

It is further ordered, sua sponte, that service shall be deemed made on respondent by sending this order, and all other orders in this case, to respondent's last known address.

It is further ordered that the clerk of this court issue certified copies of this order as provided for in Gov.Bar R. V(8)(D)(1), that publication be made as provided for in Gov.Bar R. V(8)(D)(2), and that respondent bear the costs of publication.
