
IN MANDAMUS AND PROHIBITION

ENTRY

This cause originated in this court on the filing of a complaint in mandamus/prohibition pursuant to Article II, Section 1g of the Ohio Constitution.

Upon consideration of relators' motion for leave to file first amended challenge and complaint, to strike the response to the motion to dismiss of Personhood Ohio, James Patrick Johnston, Frank Weimer, David Daubenmire, and Tom Raddell, and for sanctions and attorneys' fees pursuant to Civ.R. 11, it is ordered by the court that the motion for leave to file first amended challenge and complaint, and the motion to strike the response to the motion to dismiss are granted, and the motion for sanctions and attorneys' fees are denied.

Upon consideration of the answer of respondents Personhood Ohio, James Patrick Johnston, Frank Weimer, David Daubenmire, and Tom Raddell, and the motion to dismiss of Ohio Ballot Board, Secretary of State Jon Husted, and Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine, it is ordered by the court that the motion to dismiss is granted. Accordingly, this cause is dismissed.
