ORDER


The Board on the Unauthorized Practice of Law filed its final report in this court on April 24, 2013, recommending that, pursuant to Rule VII of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar of Ohio, the Supreme Court of Ohio issue an order finding that respondent, Paul Eugene Miller, has engaged in the unauthorized practice of law, imposing a civil penalty against respondent in the amount of \$7,000, prohibiting respondent from engaging in the unauthorized practice of law in the future, and providing for reimbursement of costs and expenses incurred by the board and relator. Respondent did not file objections to the final report, and this cause was considered by the court.

On consideration thereof, this court finds, consistent with the opinion rendered herein, that respondent's actions constitute the unauthorized practice of law. Respondent is enjoined from all conduct that constitutes the unauthorized practice of law.

It is further ordered that a civil penalty in the amount of \$7,000 is imposed upon respondent. The civil penalty shall be paid to this court by certified check or money order on or before 30 days from the date of this order. If respondent fails to pay said civil penalty on or before 30 days from the date of this order, the matter will be referred to the Attorney General for collection, and this court may find respondent in contempt.

It is further ordered that respondent provide reimbursement of costs and expenses incurred by the board and relator in the amount of \$88.05, which costs shall be payable to this court by cashier's check or money order, on or before 30 days from the date of this order. It is further ordered that if these costs are not paid in full on or before 30 days from the date of this order, interest at the rate of 10% per annum shall accrue on the balance of unpaid board costs, effective 30 days from the date of this order. It is further ordered that if costs are not paid in full on or before 30 days from the date of this order, this matter will be referred to the Attorney General for collection, and respondent may be found in contempt.

It is further ordered that the clerk of this court issue certified copies of this order as provided for in Gov.Bar R. VII(19)(E); that publication be made as provided for in Gov.Bar R. VII(19)(F); and that respondent bear the costs of publication.
