ORDER


This cause came on for further consideration upon the filing on November 9, 2012, of respondent's notice of appeal of the findings of the five-judge commission. Respondent filed objections to the findings, complainant filed an answer, oral argument was held, and this matter was considered by the court.

Upon consideration thereof, it is ordered by the court that the portion of the order of the five-judge commission publicly reprimanding respondent for her misconduct as charged in Count Three of the complaint against her is affirmed. It is further ordered that the portion of the order finding misconduct as charged in Count Two is reversed, and Count Two is dismissed. It is further ordered by the court that the stay is lifted on the enforcement of monetary sanctions and that on or before 30 days of the date of this order respondent shall pay the fine in the amount of \$1,000.00, costs in the amount of \$2,530.82, and attorney fees in the amount of \$2,500.00 which were imposed by the five-judge commission.

It is further ordered that if the fine and costs are not paid in full on or before 30 days of the date of this order, this matter may be referred to the Attorney General for collection. It is further ordered that respondent is liable for all collection costs pursuant to R.C. §131.02 if the debt is certified to the Attorney General for collection.

It is further ordered that service shall be deemed made on respondent by sending this order, and all other orders in this case, to respondent's last known address.

It is further ordered that the clerk of this court issue certified copies of this order as provided for in Gov.Bar R. V(8)(D)(1), that publication be made as provided for in Gov.Bar R. V(8)(D)(2), and that respondent bear the costs of publication.
