ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

This matter is pending before the court upon the filing on August 11, 2014, by the Board of Commissioners on Grievances and Discipline¹ of the Supreme Court of Ohio of a final report. On October 21, 2015, this court remanded this matter to the board for further consideration to determine how much restitution would be fair and appropriate for respondents to pay and to determine how that restitution should be apportioned between the two respondents in this matter. On April 11, 2016, the board filed a supplemental report and recommendation on remand. The board recommends that, pursuant to Gov.Bar R.V(6)(B)(3), respondent, Nancy Anne Zoller, Attorney Registration No. 0037933, be suspended from the practice of law for a period of one year with the suspension stayed in its entirety on the condition that she commit no further misconduct. The board further recommends that Zoller be ordered to pay \$30,466 in restitution. The board further recommends that, pursuant to Gov.Bar R.V(6)(B)(3), respondent Edward James Mamone, Attorney Registration No. 0039310, be suspended from the practice of law for a period of six months with the suspension stayed in its entirety on the condition that he commit no further misconduct. The board further recommends that Mamone be ordered to pay \$11,116 in restitution. The board further recommends that the costs of these proceedings be taxed to respondents in any disciplinary order entered, so that execution may issue.

On consideration thereof, it is ordered by the court that the parties show cause why the recommendation of the board should not be confirmed by the court and the disciplinary order so entered.

It is further ordered that any objections to the findings of fact and recommendation of the board, together with a brief in support thereof, shall be due on or before 20 days from the date of this order. It is further ordered that an answer brief may be filed on or before 15 days after any brief in support of objections has been filed.


After a hearing on the objections, or if no objections are filed within the prescribed time, the court shall enter such order as it may find proper which may be the discipline recommended by the board or which may be more severe or less severe than said recommendation.

It is further ordered that all documents filed with this court in this case shall meet the filing requirements set forth in the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court of Ohio, including

requirements as to form, number, and timeliness of filings and further that unless clearly inapplicable, the Rules of Practice shall apply to these proceedings. All documents are subject to Sup.R. 44 through 47 which govern access to court records.

It is further ordered that service shall be deemed made on respondents by sending this order, and all other orders in this case, to respondents' last known addresses.
