

MOTION TO SUPPLEMENT THE RECORD BY APPELLANTS
MEDLINK OF OHIO AND THE MEDLINK GROUP, INC.

Appellants Medlink of Ohio and The Medlink Group, Inc. ("Medlink") hereby move this Court, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule of Practice V, Section 6, to Supplement the Record with documents necessary to the Supreme Court's consideration of the questions presented on appeal.

This Court has accepted this case for review of the following Propositions of Law:

PROPOSITION OF LAW NO. 1: In reviewing an award of punitive damages, the trial court must independently analyze the three guideposts set forth by the United States Supreme Court in *BMW of North America, Inc. v. Gore* (1996), 517 U.S. 559

PROPOSITION OF LAW NO. 3: One who has never been elected to a judgeship in Ohio may not serve as a private judge under R.C. 2701.10

Medlink submits that there are documents that are not a part of the record which are necessary for a review of Proposition Of Law No. 3. The documents are public records of which the Court may take judicial notice and some of these documents did not exist until after this case was appealed to the Eighth Appellate District. Medlink moved the Eighth Appellate District to supplement these documents into the record, but that motion was denied by the appeals court.¹

A brief timeline of the case will establish why these documents could not be added to the record at the trial court level:

April 18, 2005: The parties entered into an agreement to allow Robert T. Glickman to serve as a private judge and oversee a jury trial pursuant to R.C. 2701.10.

April 25, 2005: A two week jury trial of the instant case was held with Robert T. Glickman presiding. Glickman held himself out as being qualified to serve as a private judge.² Glickman's name was listed on this Court's

¹ On appeal, Medlink moved the Eighth District Court of Appeals to modify the appellate record pursuant to App. R. 9(E), but that Motion was denied and stricken without analysis. (See Cuyahoga County Clerk of Court Docket for Appeal Case No. 87247, Motion to Modify filed October 16, 2006, and denied by Journal Entry dated November 9, 2006.)

² Glickman's biography at his law firm's website stated then, and still does today, "[p]ursuant to Ohio statute, former Judge Glickman is also active as a private judge hired by the litigants to preside over jury trials."

“Private Judge Registration Listing” after Glickman submitted an application to be a private judge despite his lack of qualifications.

- Oct. 18, 2005: Glickman entered final judgment against Medlink in the amount of \$6,803,460.00, including an award of attorney fees in the amount of \$1,013,460.00.
- Nov. 4, 2005: Medlink appealed the October 18, 2005 Final Judgment Entry. Plaintiff’s Motion for Prejudgment Interest was still pending at the time.
- Jan. 30, 2006: A prejudgment interest hearing was held before Glickman at which time counsel for Lexington Insurance Company (Medlink’s insurer) attempted to intervene. Glickman and counsel for Plaintiff told Lexington that they would not agree to Lexington intervening unless Lexington would “waive on the record any appeal regarding the validity of the private judge statute.” Lexington refused. After those comments, Medlink investigated and learned of Glickman’s lack of qualifications.
- March 2, 2006: The Ohio Supreme Court Private Judge Registration Listing includes the name Robert T. Glickman as a registered private judge.
- March 7, 2006: Medlink filed a Writ of Prohibition in this Court asking that Glickman be prohibited from deciding Plaintiff’s pending Motion for Prejudgment Interest due to his lack of qualifications to serve as a Private Judge. (Case No. 2006-0478).
- March 9, 2006: Medlink filed its Appellant Brief in the Eighth Appellate District, raising the argument that the proceedings were void because of Glickman’s lack of qualifications.
- March 14, 2006: Despite Medlink’s pending Writ of Prohibition, Glickman awarded prejudgment interest to Plaintiff in the amount of \$896,381.99.
- May 4, 2006: Medlink filed an Application for Dismissal of its Writ of Prohibition which was granted by this Court.³
- June 29, 2006: The Ohio Supreme Court Private Judge Registration Listing no longer has Robert T. Glickman listed as a registered private judge.
- Dec. 11, 2006: The Eighth District Court of Appeals affirmed the proceedings in their entirety and held that Glickman was qualified to be a private judge.
- Jan. 25, 2007: Medlink filed a Notice of Appeal with this Court.

³ The Application for Dismissal was filed because after Glickman ruled on prejudgment interest there was no longer any activity to prohibit.

June 6, 2007: This Court accepted this case for review.

Once Medlink became aware of Glickman's lack of qualifications to serve as a private judge, Medlink immediately filed a Writ of Prohibition with this Court, asking that Glickman be prohibited from deciding the only matter left unresolved at the trial court level – Plaintiff's Motion for Prejudgment Interest. Instead of waiting for this Court's decision on the matter, Glickman quickly awarded prejudgment interest to Plaintiff and divested himself of "jurisdiction." At that point, the case was on appeal in the Eighth District Court of Appeals and there was no way for Medlink to supplement the trial court record.

On appeal, Medlink raised the argument that the entire underlying proceeding was void due to Glickman's lack of qualifications. Medlink asked the Eighth District to modify its record on appeal to allow the documents necessary for its review of the issue to be made a part of the record. That motion was denied without any analysis. (See Judgment Entry, dated November 9, 2006).

The documents Medlink asks this Court to supplement into the Record are the following, all of which were requested to be added on appeal and are attached hereto at the Appendix:

- (4) The Supreme Court of Ohio, Office of Judicial & Court Services, letter from Director to Hon. Robert T. Glickman, dated March 14, 2006
- (5) The State of Ohio, Governor Taft appointment of Robert T. Glickman to Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court; dated June 26, 2001
- (6) Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, Official Election Tabulation, dated November 5, 2002
- (7) The State of Ohio, Governor Taft appointment of Robert T. Glickman to Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, dated April 2, 2003
- (8) Cuyahoga County Primary Election Statistics, dated March 2, 2004
- (9) Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Meeting Agenda dated June 7, 2004, recognizing withdrawal of Robert T. Glickman as candidate for Judge in Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, General Division

I. INTRODUCTION

This Court accepted for review the question of whether one who has never been elected to a judgeship in Ohio may serve as a private judge under R.C. 2701.10. Medlink asks this Court to hold in the negative. It is Medlink's position that Robert T. Glickman, who presided over the jury trial in this case as a private judge and purportedly pursuant to R.C. 2701.10, was not eligible to serve as a private judge under the requirements of R.C. 2701.10 because he was never elected to the Bench.

Specifically, R.C. 2701.10 provides eligibility for two kinds of retired judges to serve as private judges: (1) voluntarily retired judges, who must be elected⁴; and (2) judges who are over the age of 70 and were required to retire under Article IV, § 6 of the Ohio Constitution. Because Glickman was never elected to the Bench, and has not reached the age of 70, he has not retired under Article IV, § 6 of the Ohio Constitution. Accordingly, it is Medlink's position that all actions taken in the within case subsequent to its referral to Glickman are invalid and void ab initio.

Plaintiff-Appellee ("Plaintiff") argued below that Medlink's argument – that Glickman does not meet the mandatory requirements to be a "voluntarily retired judge" – assumes facts that are not in the record. (See, *Corrected Brief of Plaintiff-Appellee/Cross-Appellant, Andrea Barnes, Executrix*, filed May 15, 2006, at p. 48.) Plaintiff also argued that there is no factual evidence in the record that Glickman is not over the age of seventy. (See *Reply Brief Of Plaintiff-Appellee/Cross-Appellant, Robert Barnes, Executrix*, filed July 12, 2006, at p. 2, fn. 2.)

⁴ Rule VI(C)(2) of the Ohio Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Judiciary states that a "voluntarily retired judge" is any person who was elected to and served on an Ohio court without being defeated in an election for new or continued service on that court." Gov. Jud. R. VI(C)(2). See *State ex rel. Russo v. McDonnell*, 2006-Ohio-3459, at footnote 1, confirming that a "voluntarily retired judge" under R.C. 2701.10 must be elected to the Bench.

The above-listed documents offer support for the factual propositions that (1) Glickman was never elected to the Bench in the State of Ohio, (2) Glickman did not reach the age of 70 before leaving the Bench, and (3) the position taken by the Supreme Court of Ohio, Office of Judicial & Court Services, that Glickman does not meet the qualifications to serve as a private judge under R.C. 2701.10. These documents are public records which are relevant to the issue accepted by this Court for review and should be considered by the parties in their Briefs. For these reasons, Medlink asks that these documents be added to the record.

II. DESCRIPTION OF SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTS

The following is a brief description of the relevance of the public records which Medlink seeks to have added to the appeals record.

A. The Supreme Court of Ohio Registration of Retired Judge for Robert T. Glickman, dated July 2, 2004

On July 2, 2004, Robert T. Glickman submitted his Registration Of Retired Judge to this Court. That Registration provides, among other things, Glickman's date of birth as June 14, 1966 and is signed by Robert T. Glickman. This document provides factual evidence that Glickman had not reached the age of 70 before leaving the Bench.

B. The Supreme Court of Ohio Private Judge Registration Listings

After Glickman submitted his Registration of July 2, 2004, referenced above, he was added to this Court's Private Judge Registration Listing. A copy of the version as it existed on March 2, 2006 indicates that Glickman was on the List. A second copy of the version as it existed June 29, 2006 indicates that Glickman was removed from the List.

C. The Supreme Court of Ohio Office of Judicial & Court Services Letter

On March 14, 2006, correspondence was sent from Douglas R. Stephens, Director of the Office of Judicial & Court Services for the Supreme Court of Ohio, to Robert T. Glickman

indicating that a determination was made that Glickman's name should not appear on the listing of appropriately registered private judges kept by the Supreme Court of Ohio.

D. Governor Taft Appointment Records

Records from the Governor of the State of Ohio provide factual support for the fact that Robert T. Glickman was twice appointed (not elected) to the Bench for the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, once on June 26, 2001, and a second time on April 2, 2003. These documents are relevant to establish how Glickman became a judge for the Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, i.e., that he was not elected.


E. Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Documents

Documents from the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections indicate that Glickman ran for the position of Judge for the Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court in November, 2002 and lost to John P. O'Donnell. The records further reflect that, after being appointed by Governor Taft for a second time in 2003, Glickman won the Republican primary unopposed but withdrew his candidacy on April 30, 2004. These documents are relevant to this appeal because they detail the circumstances surrounding Glickman's service on the Bench and the fact that Glickman did not retire from the Bench as an elected judge.

III. CONCLUSION

These documents are directly relevant to the issues raised on appeal, are public records, and Medlink respectfully asks that this Court supplement the record to permit their inclusion.



Among those prosecuted and convicted were the former Mahoning County Prosecutor and the City of Canfield Prosecutor for fixing cases for the "Strollo" organized crime
