NOTICE OF ORAL ARGUMENT

The Supreme Court of Ohio will hold an oral argument on the merits in this case on Tuesday, January 8, 2008. Time allowed for oral argument will be 15 minutes per side. Counsel for relator shall argue first.

Attorneys who argue before the Court must comply with the provisions of Rule IX of the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court of Ohio and the instructions that follow. Pursuant to Rule IX, Section 3, counsel for either or both parties may waive oral argument and submit the case upon briefs. Effective January 1, 2008, the Clerk must be notified in writing of the waiver at least seven days before the date scheduled for the oral argument.

Court convenes promptly at 9 a.m. Counsel in all cases are expected to be present when court convenes. Counsel must register with the Chief Deputy Clerk **prior to 8:45 a.m.** at the information desk outside the Courtroom on the first floor of the Ohio Judicial Center.
