

**RELATOR'S REPORT REGARDING RESPONDENT'S
COMPLIANCE WITH MONITORING**

INTRODUCTION

On March 30, 2005, this Court filed an order suspending respondent, Robert L. Beeler, from the practice of law for two years with 18 months of the suspension stayed. The court ordered that respondent be placed on probation for two years following his reinstatement with conditions. The Court further ordered that during his period of probation, respondent be monitored by an attorney.

By order filed November 3, 2005, respondent was reinstated to the practice of law and placed on probation. Relator appointed Attorney Robert B. Hollister to oversee respondent's practice and office procedures, with periodic reports to be made to relator.

Now comes relator, Disciplinary Counsel, and submits a report regarding respondent's compliance with the monitoring ordered by this Court on November 3, 2005.

RELATOR'S REPORT


In addition to the requirements set forth in Gov. Bar R.V(9), this Court's November 3, 2005 order required that respondent permit his monitor access to regular audits of his business and trust accounts and that respondent provide client releases so as to allow the monitor to have full access to respondent's client files. The Court further required that respondent review all of his existing files and that he cooperate with the monitor in correcting any outstanding improperly witnessed documents.

Pursuant to this Court's order, relator supervised the term of respondent's probation and maintained respondent's probation file. Relator received and reviewed timely reports from Mr. Hollister regarding respondent's compliance with the terms of his probation. At no time during respondent's two-year probation period did relator receive a report of a probation violation.


Relator's evaluation of the periodic reports submitted by Mr. Hollister indicates that respondent has fully complied with the monitoring requirements. An evaluation of the material submitted by respondent with his "application to terminate probation" indicates that respondent has complied with all of the terms and conditions of his probation.

In consideration of all of the foregoing and upon the submission of this report, this Court may now consider respondent's application for termination of probation.


