

CLAIM DETERMINATION ENTRY

In Re Application of Jewell Jackson v. Dea Lynn Character
Claim Number 08-0030

This cause came on for hearing before the Board of Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund this 10th September, 2010 on the application of Jewell Jackson alleging a loss in the amount of \$50,000, caused by dishonest conduct of an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Ohio.

The Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund of Ohio find that:

- a) An attorney client relationship did exist between the claimant and Dea Lynn Character.
- b) The claimant suffered a loss of \$50,550 on or about August, 2006.

The Commissioners further find that the dishonest conduct consisted of theft by fiduciary, and that the following disciplinary proceedings were taken:

Felony Suspension on 10/30/2009

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.

Therefore the Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund do hereby determine that the claim of Jewell Jackson is eligible for reimbursement in the amount of \$50,550.

Payment of said amount is conditioned upon claimant complying with the subrogation assignment and other requirements of Sec. 6 of GOV. Rule VIII of the Ohio Supreme Court.
