


MOTION TO EXPEDITE

This motion to expedite is being filed to give the relator additional consideration for immediate relief in the original action in mandamus filed. The details are being filed in a formal police report complaint as a serious incident report.

MOTION TO EXPEDITE

My name is Yvette Barbara Baldwin. I am a citizen of Hamilton County, Ohio; currently residing with a relative in the greater Cincinnati area. I am filing a complaint to report a serious incident of an attempt against my life that occurred on Thursday June 2nd, 2011; at approximately 12:48 P.M. I travelled to the Lockland Post office located on Anna Street, in the village of Lockland, Ohio in Hamilton County via the 78 bus route, to check on mail that I had placed on hold. I arrived at the post office at approximately 12:00 noon. I left the post office immediately after checking for mail that appears to have been stopped or not received. I tried to catch the 78 bus returning into town but I was unable to get the attention of the bus driver as I ran across the parking lot adjacent to the post office. I walked through the village of Lockland via Wyoming Ave., going through the City of Wyoming to Springfield Pike. The next bus into town was due in approximately 25 minutes, instead of waiting in Wyoming I decided to walk out Springfield Pike (Route 4) into the Cincinnati, Hartwell area. Just after I entered the City of Cincinnati boundaries, I noticed 2 female black adult women leaving the beauty supply store in the area near 8455 Vine Street. The women appeared to be in their late 20's to early 30's. I was advised by the women as they walked past that there was a murder hit on me. I processed the information as to mean at any point in time. I did not ask any questions I continued walking down the street until I was able to cross over to the opposite side of the street. I stopped at the Dollar Discount store to make a small purchase. I left the Dollar Discount store and proceeded to walk down Vine Street towards Galbraith Road. At the corner of Vine Street and Pfau Avenue, just prior to the intersection of Vine and Galbraith, there is a Lee's Famous Recipe Chicken Restaurant. I stopped at the corner to check for traffic prior to crossing Pfau Avenue. I noticed one of the employees at the Lee's Famous Recipe Chicken Restaurant standing on the side of the building that faces Pfau; he was actually leaning over the railing as if taking a break. The employee appeared to have on a uniform; he was a male white medium build and medium height. I also observed a female white approx mid 20's in age, walking down Pfau Avenue. She had 2 toddlers/preschool children with her. I continued walking into the intersection when I observed a midsized, vintage burgundy to dark red in color, vehicle making a left hand turn from travelling north on Vine Street onto Pfau Avenue. I observed a female white driver with a passenger in the front street. The unusual circumstances surrounding this event occurred when I was halfway into the intersection the female white driver continued at full speed making a left hand turn without stopping to signal or to check for pedestrians. She made the turn at full speed short cutting the turn so that she could hit me after I had walked past a certain point in the intersection. I thought I was about dead. I panicked because I couldn't jump ahead forward to get out of the way. All I could do was jump backwards but I still couldn't get out of the way of the vehicle. When I jumped backwards to move partially out of the way she veered her car in the same direction that I jumped instead of continuing on. I jumped again trying to move forward and land on part of her hood to decrease the injuries and save my life but she veered again. I could only stare straight

into her eyes hoping to break her train of thought to give me a chance to move out of the way. The entire incident was split second. I was able to jump past the front fender to the driver's side of the car, visibly shaken up; I looked directly at her through the driver's side of the car. She was a female white, with blonde medium length to long hair, early to mid 20's. I was completely terrorized by the incident. I was able to think clear enough to get the license plate number; Ohio license plate ERZ3904. She continued west on Pfau to Galbraith Road and west on Galbraith Road towards Winton Road in the Springfield Township area. I did not call the Police Department to report the incident. I needed to calm down. I decided to take care of a few matters that I had pending before making a report. I waited for the next bus and travelled to the Hoxworth Blood Center on Highland Avenue to make a blood donation. The police station and the Court system may want further clarification on the seriousness of this incident. I have been harassed and terrorized and threatened for months about possible attempts on my life and attempts to harm me. I ignore the verbal threats on a regular basis. I make every effort that I can to maintain safety measures as much as any citizen can. If I reported all of the verbal threats and harassment concerns that I experience, I would probably be tagged as a fearful citizen. I would appreciate the assistance of the Justice system in the State of Ohio; as to taking a serious look at this complaint and the 2 federal civil complaints that I have in process. I have a federal civil petition in process at the United States District Court Southern District of Ohio in the Western Division, Case No. 1:10CV952 and The Ohio Supreme Court Complaint Case No. 2011-0712. Both cases are associated with wealth and personal property of historical value that I have sole authority and legal rights to. I have tried to gain access to my assets that are solely legally in my name. The cases are still open and pending. I am literally confused concerning the overall matter as to why there would be any challenge to my assets. I am waiting for the courts to provide me with an explanation. This case is of such serious matter that I have to explain another incident. The weekdays after the Mother's Day Sunday I travelled into downtown Cincinnati to use a gift card from T.J. Maxx retail store. I was browsing for a few minutes when a couple of female black adult women approached me in the middle of the aisle and both of them stated in unison "What are you doing here, you were killed, you are supposed to be dead". There were several other women shoppers standing there in awe with me at the statement. I was a little shocked. I did not know either of the women personally; I could identify one of the women in a lineup due to the fact that I have seen her around Hamilton County on previous occasions. There are too many incidents and threats to report. I realize that I have to leave the Hamilton County area. I have attempted to access my assets to use towards relocation, but I have been delayed by indirect denial of access. I will use this complaint process as a motion to expedite and or a motion to amend the petitions/pleadings that I have in process with the Federal court system. In addition I will file a police report with the local police department within a couple of days of this incident.
