
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

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Representatives, I was involved with preparing for the Ohio reapportionment process until my resignation on August 4, 2011.

6. On July 6, 2011, Maptitude licenses were purchased using funds allocated by the Legislative Task Force on Redistricting, Reapportionment and Demographic Research ("Legislative Task Force") from Caliper for use in drafting a reapportionment plan.

7. On July 7-8, 2011, I received training from John Morgan, a consultant hired by our attorney, Mark Braden, on the GIS software, Maptitude. This software was used to develop the 2011 redistricting and reapportionment plans.

8. On July 15, 2011, with technical advice and assistance from the IT Director of the Senate, computer equipment to be used for redistricting and reapportionment was purchased.

9. From July 17, 2011 through October 15, 2011, a hotel room at the Doubletree Hotel in downtown Columbus was leased to use as an office space for redistricting and reapportionment.

10. The costs for the Maptitude software, the computer equipment, and the lease of the Doubletree hotel room were paid from funds set aside for each caucus for use in apportionment efforts. These were funds allocated by the Legislative Task Force through a resolution signed by Minority Leader Capri Cafaro and Speaker William Batchelder as chairs of the Legislative Task Force. A true and accurate copy of the Proposed Terms and Conditions of Caucus and Non-Caucus Allocation of Funds is attached as Exhibit 1. Both the Republican and

Democratic Caucuses received an equal amount of funding for reapportionment efforts. Each pair of caucuses was authorized to use these funds for hardware, software, physical space, supplies and/or consulting. All receipts and invoices for these expenditures are matters of public record.

11. Beginning in July 2011, I, along with Raymond DiRossi, sought to coordinate "weekly" meetings with the staff leaders of the Ohio House of Representatives, the Ohio Senate, the Governor's office, and eventually Auditor Yost, to discuss both Congressional redistricting and reapportionment, though Auditor Yost or his staff never participated in any Congressional redistricting related meetings. Ultimately, due to scheduling conflicts and the fact that they were no longer necessary, a vast majority of those "weekly" meetings were cancelled and never held. In fact, those weekly meetings occurred no more 3 times from July through October, 2011. And, we never discussed any draft or final maps at these "weekly" meetings but only the apportionment process, generally.

12. On August 5, 2011, a contract was executed between Republican members of the Legislative Task Force and Policy Widgets, LLC to provide consulting on redistricting and reapportionment. A true and accurate copy of that agreement is attached as Exhibit 2.

13. On August 4, 2011, the Ohio Apportionment Board held its organizational meeting where Raymond DiRossi and I were appointed as the Joint Secretaries to the Ohio Apportionment Board by unanimous vote.

14. As a Joint Secretary, many of my initial responsibilities were administrative in nature, including organizing and preparing for the process of drafting the reapportionment plan, as well as the planning and organizing of both the meetings of the Ohio Apportionment Board and the regional public hearings on reapportionment to be held throughout the state of Ohio, the adoption of the rules for the Ohio Apportionment Board, and maintaining the official records of the Ohio Apportionment Board activities. These administrative activities were very time consuming.

15. From August 22, 2011 through August 26, 2011, the Ohio Apportionment Board held 11 regional hearings around the state to hear public testimony. The public hearing schedule was set by the Ohio Apportionment Board on August 4, 2011, published on several official websites, and sent to statewide media.

16. Pursuant to the rules adopted by the Ohio Apportionment Board at its initial meeting on August 4, 2011, the deadline for the submission of any reapportionment plans to the Ohio Apportionment Board was September 23, 2011. Also under the rules adopted by the Ohio Apportionment Board, and under my duties as a Joint Secretary of the Ohio Apportionment Board, Raymond DiRossi and I distributed copies of the submitted plans to designated agents for each of the five members of the Ohio Apportionment Board on that date.

17. One of the plans submitted to the Ohio Apportionment Board on September 23, 2011 was the apportionment plan prepared by Raymond DiRossi and

myself ("Joint Secretaries' Plan"). A true and accurate copy of the Joint Secretaries' Plan as submitted on September 23, 2011 is attached as Exhibit 3.

18. There were three other plans submitted to the Ohio Apportionment Board on or before September 23, 2011. Two of the plans were from the "winners" of the "Draw the Line Ohio" contest put on by the Ohio Campaign for Accountable Redistricting. The other was submitted by the Joint Democratic Caucuses. True and accurate copies of these plans as submitted are attached as Exhibits 4 and 5, respectively.

19. On September 26, 2011, the Ohio Apportionment Board heard testimony on all four of the submitted plans. This date was set by the Ohio Apportionment Board at its initial meeting on August 4, 2011.

20. On September 28, 2011, the Ohio Apportionment Board voted 5-0 to adopt a technical amendment to the Joint Secretaries' plan. A substantive amendment (Amendment A) to the Joint Secretaries' plan was offered which included changes to senate districts in Cuyahoga County. After debate between the Apportionment Board Members, Amendment A was amended to remove the changes to the Senate districts in Cuyahoga County and adopted on a 4-1 vote. The Board then voted 4-1 to adopt the Joint Secretaries Plan. A true and accurate copy of the Technical Amendment is attached as Exhibit 6. A true and accurate copy of Amendment A is attached as Exhibit 7.

21. The Ohio Apportionment Board held an emergency meeting on September 30, 2011 to consider Amendment B to the Joint Secretaries' Plan to

reinstate the changes to the senate districts in Cuyahoga County based on feedback received from Representative Sandra Williams. A true and accurate copy of Amendment B and the handout related to Amendment B are attached as Exhibits 8 and 9, respectively. A true and accurate copy of a press release from Representative Sandra Williams, who serves as Chairwoman to the Ohio Legislative Black Caucus, regarding the Cuyahoga County senate districts is attached as Exhibit 10. The Ohio Apportionment Board adopted the amended apportionment plan on September 30, 2011 on a 4-0 vote ("2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan"). House Minority Leader Armond Budish was not able to attend this meeting. A true and accurate copy of Leader Budish's absentee letter is attached as Exhibit 11.

22. The 2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan was not developed in secret. All deliberations by members of the Ohio Apportionment Board were open to the public. The rules adopted by the Apportionment Board required public posting of all hearings; 24 hours advance notice of regular meetings in accordance with the "open meetings statute" (R.C. 122.11); the recording of detailed minutes by a court reporter; the adoption of a public records policy, and the designation of a public records officer. The Ohio Apportionment Board held four public meetings and 11 regional hearings where the public could and did submit testimony. And, suggestions made at these hearings were incorporated into the reapportionment plan including (1) requests to keep Columbiana and Allen Counties whole in single house districts; (2) requests to keep whole or minimize splits of governmental units such as Kettering; and (3) requests from the Ohio NAACP to protect and maintain

the number of African-American seats in the legislature. Later in the process, the Ohio Commission on Hispanic and Latino Affairs requested that the Ohio Apportionment Board protect the Hispanic communities in Lorain and Cuyahoga Counties. A true and accurate copy of the letter from OCHLA sent to Auditor Yost, and which was forwarded to me, is attached as Exhibit 12.

23. Additionally, although agenda scripts were provided to staff members of the Republican members of the Ohio Apportionment Board prior to the public meetings to serve as a template for a smooth and organized meeting, the Ohio Apportionment Board members deviated from the agenda scripts on multiple occasions.

24. I assisting in coordinating a group meeting in June, 2011 with Mark Braden, counsel to the Legislative Task Force, Auditor Yost, Governor Kasich, Senate President Niehaus, Speaker Batchelder, and Secretary Husted. I also assisted in coordinating a series of individual meetings with Auditor Yost, Governor Kasich, Senate President Niehaus, Speaker Batchelder, and Secretary Husted's staff with Mark Braden and his consultant, John Morgan in July, 2011. But, these initial meetings in June and July were for the purpose of obtaining general legal advice on the Congressional redistricting and apportionment processes. At the time of these meetings, we had not even begun to draft the apportionment plan, purchased any software or computers, or received the final data required for the process to draw map. Additionally, the Ohio Apportionment Board had not yet been convened pursuant to Article XI, Section 1.

25. Occasionally, though not often, an individual member of the Ohio Apportionment Board, or their staff, would come to the Doubletree Hotel office to monitor the progress of the draft of the reapportionment and Congressional redistricting plans in late August and September.

26. On only one occasion were two members of the Ohio Apportionment Board together with me at the Doubletree hotel at the same time. To the best of my recollection, one time in mid-September, Auditor Yost and Senate President Niehaus were at the Doubletree hotel office in passing, as one was arriving, and the other was leaving. I witnessed no discussions between Auditor Yost and Senate President Niehaus about the specifics of the apportionment plan. At no other time when I was present was more than one member of the Ohio Apportionment Board present at the Doubletree Hotel office at the same time.

27. Additionally, the 2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan was drafted in compliance with Article XI of the Ohio Constitution.

28. True and accurate copies of the statewide maps from the 2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan for both the House Districts and the Senate Districts are attached as Exhibits 13 and 14, respectively.

29. True and accurate copies of the maps for each individual House District and Senate District established by the 2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan are attached as Exhibits 15 and 16, respectively.

30. A true and accurate copy of a color coded map of Ohio counties illustrating certain counties having special protection under Article XI of the Ohio

Constitution is attached as Exhibit 17. On this map, the county in dark red must be made a single county house district under Article XI, Section 10(A). Counties in yellow may be made a single county house district under Article XI, Section 10(B). Counties in red have one or more House of Representatives ratio of representation, and, therefore, are restricted in the manner in which they may be combined into house and senate districts under Article XI, Sections 8 and 11. Finally, counties in green contain less than one House of Representatives ratio of representation and shall be combined into representative districts under Article XI, Section 10(D).

31. A true and accurate copy of a chart I prepared comparing the historical Ohio Apportionment Board schedules with a proposed schedule for the 2011 Ohio Apportionment Board is attached as Exhibit 18.

32. A true and accurate copy of a chart showing which counties under the 2011 census may or must be made single county house districts is attached as Exhibit 19.

33. A true and accurate copy of a chart summarizing all 88 Ohio counties' population and number of House of Representatives ratio of representation under the 2000 and 2010 census data is attached as Exhibit 20.

34. A true and accurate copy of a chart Raymond DiRossi and I prepared comparing the four apportionment plans submitted to the Ohio Apportionment Board on September 23, 2011 is attached as Exhibit 21.

35. True and accurate copies of maps and lists displaying the population deviations and racial demographics for the 2010 census data applied to the 2001 house and senate districts, respectively, are attached as Exhibits 22 and 23.

36. True and accurate copies of the final political indices for the house and senate districts under the 2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan are attached as Exhibit 24.

II. SECTION 7(B) AND (C) VIOLATIONS

37. Relators have alleged that Sections (B) and (C) of Article XI of the Constitution were violated in House Districts, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 27, 28, 31, 34, 35, 36, 38, 40, 41, 43, 45, 48, 49, 55, 57, 60, 61, 69, 70, 71, 72, 84, 94, and 95, and Section (B) has been violated in House Districts 58, 59, and 78. But, in each of these House Districts, the Ohio Apportionment Board only divided one governmental unit in compliance with Article XI, Sections (B) and (C).

38. In order to understand why the Ohio Apportionment Board only divided one governmental unit in each of the above House Districts, it is important to understand the geography of the governmental units. The Ohio Apportionment Board only divided at most one contiguous governmental unit in each house district. If a governmental unit was non-contiguous, it was not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board, but was already divided by local officials through annexation. On page 65 of the 2012-2022 Ohio Apportionment Plan, a non-contiguous area is defined as an area that is legally or technically a portion of a geographic unit but surrounded by other land-based geographic units.

39. The first eight causes of action relate to House Districts in Franklin County. Franklin County contains over 325 non-contiguous areas of governmental units: Blendon Township is divided into 14 non-contiguous portions; Clinton Township is divided into 17 non-contiguous portions; Franklin Township is divided into 37 non-contiguous portions; Hamilton Township is divided into 18 non-contiguous portions; Hilliard City is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions; Jackson Township is divided into 12 non-contiguous portions; Jefferson Township is divided into 21 non-contiguous portions; Madison Township is divided into 28 non-contiguous portions; Mifflin Township is divided into 19 non-contiguous portions; Norwich Township is divided into 20 non-contiguous portions; Perry Township is divided into 34 non-contiguous portions; Prairie Township is divided into 17 non-contiguous portions; Sharon Township is divided into 23 non-contiguous portions; Truro Township is divided into 16 non-contiguous portions; and Washington Township is divided into 22 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Franklin County is attached as Exhibit 25. True and accurate copies of the maps for each of the individual governmental units referenced above are attached as Exhibits 26 through 40, respectively. Note that Relators refer to a "Milton" Township in the 3rd cause of action; presumably this is a typographical error as there is no "Milton" Township in Franklin County, and likely refers to Mifflin Township.

40. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 17 is the City of Columbus, Ward 31 (split on precincts). Portions of

Wards 50 and 70 of Columbus City, Franklin Township, and Hamilton Township in House District 17 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

41. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 18 is the City of Columbus, Ward 31 (split on precincts). Portions of Clinton Township in House District 18 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

42. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 19 is the City of Columbus, Ward 81 (split on precincts). Portions of Blendon Township, Jefferson Township, Mifflin Township, and Sharon Township in House District 19 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

43. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 20 is the City of Columbus, Ward 45 (split on precincts). Portions of Hamilton Township, Jefferson Township, Madison Township, and Truro Township in House District 20 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

44. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 21 is the City of Columbus (split on wards). Portions of Norwich Township, Perry Township, Sharon Township, and Washington Township in House

District 21 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

45. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 22 is the City of Columbus, Ward 22 (split on precincts). Portions of Wards 59 of Columbus City, Blendon Township, Clinton Township, Perry Township, and Sharon Township in House District 22 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

46. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 23 is the City of Columbus (split on wards). Portions of Ward 79 Columbus City, Hilliard City, Franklin Township, Norwich Township, and Prairie Township in House District 23 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

47. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 24 is the City of Columbus, Ward 22 (split on precincts). Portions of Franklin Township, Hilliard City, Norwich Township, Perry Township, Prairie Township, Sharon Township, and Washington Township in House District 24 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

48. The 9-11th causes of action relate to House Districts in Hamilton County. Hamilton County contains over 38 non-contiguous portions of governmental units: Columbia Township is divided into 18 non-contiguous portions;

Springfield Township is divided into 17 non-contiguous portions; and Sycamore Township is divided into 3 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Hamilton County is attached as Exhibit 41. True and accurate copies of the maps for each of the individual governmental units referenced above are attached as Exhibits 42 through 44, respectively.

49. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 27 is the City of Cincinnati (split on wards). Portions of Columbia Township in House District 27 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and it was not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

50. No units were divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 28. Portions of Springfield Township and Sycamore Township in House District 28 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

51. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 31 is the City of Cincinnati (split on wards). Portions of Columbia Township in House District 31 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and it was not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

52. The 12-15th causes of action and the 20th and 21st causes of action relate to House Districts in Summit County and Stark County. Summit County contains at least 25 non-contiguous portions of governmental units: Bath Township is divided into 5 non-contiguous portions; Coventry Township is divided into 7 non-

contiguous portions; Cuyahoga Falls City is divided into 6 non-contiguous portions; and Springfield Township is divided into 7 non-contiguous portions. Stark County contains at least 55 non-contiguous portions of governmental units: Bethlehem Township is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions; Canton Township is divided into 11 non-contiguous portions; Osnaburg Township is divided into 11 non-contiguous portions; Perry Township is divided into 11 non-contiguous portions; Plain Township is divided into 22 non-contiguous portions; and Tuscarawas Township is divided into 6 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Summit County is attached as Exhibit 45. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Stark County is attached as Exhibit 50. True and accurate copies of the maps for each of the individual governmental units referenced above are attached as Exhibits 46 through 49 and Exhibits 51 through 56, respectively.

53. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 34 is the City of Akron, Ward 2 (split on precincts). Portions of Bath Township and Cuyahoga Falls Township in House District 34 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

54. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 35 is the City of Akron, Ward 2 (split on precincts). Coventry Township and Springfield Township in House District 35 are non-contiguous to

other portions of Coventry Township and Springfield Township not in House District 35.

55. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 36 is the City of Cuyahoga Falls (split on wards). Portions of Coventry Township, Cuyahoga Falls, and Springfield Township in House District 36 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board. House District 36 provides an example of where even though portions of Cuyahoga Falls in the district were non-contiguous to portions in other house districts, we still counted the "split" of contiguous portions of Cuyahoga Falls as a division by the action of the Ohio Apportionment Board.

56. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 38 is the City of Massillon (split on wards). Portions of Tuscarawas Township and Bath Township in House District 38 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

57. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 48 is Plain Township (split on precincts). Portions of Bethlehem Township, Canton Township, and Perry Township in House District 48 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

58. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 49 is Massillon City (split on wards). Portions of Bethlehem Township, Canton Township, Osnaburg Township, Perry Township, Plain Township, and Tuscarawas Township in House District 49 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

59. The 16-18th causes of action relate to House Districts in Montgomery County. Montgomery County contains at least 29 non-contiguous portions of governmental units: Clay Township is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions; Clayton City is divided into 4 non-contiguous portions; Dayton City is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions; Harrison Township is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions; Jefferson Township is divided into 7 non-contiguous portions; Miami Township is divided into 3 non-contiguous portions; Riverside City is divided into 6 non-contiguous portions; and Trotwood City is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Montgomery County is attached as Exhibit 57. True and accurate copies of the maps for each of the individual governmental units referenced above are attached as Exhibits 58 through 65, respectively.

60. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 40 is the City of Dayton, Ward 3 (split on precincts). Portions of Clayton City, Clay Township, Harrison Township, and Riverside City in House

District 40 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

61. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 41 is the City of Dayton (split on wards). Portions of Riverside City in House District 41 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

62. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 43 is the City of Dayton, Ward 3 (split on precincts). Portions of Clayton City, Harrison Township, and Trotwood City in House District 43 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

63. The 19th cause of action relates to House District 45 in Lucas County. In Lucas County, Sylvania Township is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the boundary for Sylvania Township is attached as Exhibit 66.

64. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 45 is the City of Toledo (split on wards). Portions of Sylvania Township in House District 45 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

65. The 22nd and 23rd causes of action related to House Districts in Lorain County. In Lorain County, Eaton Township is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions and Grafton Township is divided into 2 non-contiguous portions. True and

accurate copies of the maps of Grafton Township and Eaton Township are attached as Exhibits 67 and _68, respectively.

66. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 55 is the City of North Ridgeville, Ward 3 (split on precincts). Portions of Eaton Township and Grafton Township in House District 55 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

67. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 57 is the City of North Ridgeville, Ward 3 (split on precincts). Portions of Eaton Township and Grafton Township in House District 57 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

68. The 24th and 25th causes of action are solely for violations of Section 7(B) and relate to House Districts in Mahoning County.

69. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 58 is Austintown Township. Additionally, House District 58 follows almost exactly the same geography as House District 60 from the 2001 Ohio Apportionment Plan consistent with Article XI, Section 7(D) of the Ohio Constitution. And, additional care was taken to not draw two Democratic incumbent representatives into the same House District. A true and accurate copy of maps of House Districts 59 and 60 from the 2001 Ohio Apportionment Plan

compared to House Districts 58 and 69 from the 2011 Apportionment Plan is attached as Exhibit 69.

70. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 59 is Austintown Township. But, House District 59 follows almost exactly the same geography as House District 59 from the 2001 Ohio Apportionment Plan consistent with Article XI, Section 7(D) of the Ohio Constitution. However, the district boundaries were altered so that the new district population fell within the deviations acceptable under Article XI, Section 3. Finally, additional care was taken to not draw two Democratic incumbent representatives into the same House District in Mahoning County.

71. The 26th and 27th causes of action relates to House Districts in Lake County. In Lake County, Painesville Township is divided into 8 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the boundary for Painesville Township is attached as Exhibit 70.

72. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 60 is the City of Mentor (split on wards). Portions of Painesville Township in House District 60 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

73. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 61 is the City of Mentor (split on wards). Portions of Painesville Township in House District 61 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

74. The 28th and 29th causes of action relate to House District in Medina County. In Medina County, Brunswick Hills Township is divided into 19 non-contiguous portions, and York Township is divided into 4 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Medina County is attached as Exhibit 71. True and accurate copies of the maps of Brunswick Hills Township and York Township are attached as Exhibits 72 and 73, respectively.

75. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 69 is the City of Brunswick (split on wards). Portions of Brunswick Hills Township and York Township in House District 69 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

76. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 70 is the City of Brunswick (split on wards). Portions of Brunswick Hills Township and York Township in House District 70 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

77. The 30th cause of action relates to House District 71 in Licking County. In Licking County, Etna Township is split into 2 non-contiguous portions; Madison Township is split into 2 non-contiguous portions; and Newark Township is divided into 14 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Licking County is attached as

Exhibit 74. True and accurate copies of the maps for Etna Township, Madison Township, and Newark Township are attached as Exhibits 75 through 77, respectively.

78. No units were divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 71. Portions of Etna Township and Madison Township in House District 71 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

79. The 31st cause of action alleges a violation of Section 7(B) and relates to a House District in Pickaway County. In Pickaway County, Circleville Township is divided into 4 non-contiguous portions and Harrison Township is divided into 6 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in Pickaway County is attached as Exhibit 78. True and accurate copies of the maps of Circleville Township and Harrison Township are attached as Exhibits 79 and 80, respectively.

80. No units were divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 78. Portions of Circleville Township in House District 78 are non-contiguous to other portions of this governmental unit in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

81. The 32nd cause of action relates to House Districts in Auglaize County. In Auglaize County, Duchoquet Township is divided into 4 non-contiguous portions and St. Mary's Township is divided into 3 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map showing the non-contiguous governmental units in

Auglaize County is attached as Exhibit 81. True and accurate copies of the maps of Duchoquet Township and St. Mary's Township are attached as Exhibits 82 and 83, respectively.

82. No units were divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 84. Portions of Duchoquet Township and St. Mary's Township in House District 84 are non-contiguous to portions of these governmental units in other districts and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

83. The 34th and 35th causes of action relate to House Districts in Washington County. In Washington County, Marietta Township is divided into 4 non-contiguous portions. A true and accurate copy of the map of Marietta Township is attached as Exhibit 84.

84. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 94 is the City of Marietta (split on wards). Portions of Marietta Township in House District 94 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in House District 95 and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

85. The only unit divided by action of the Ohio Apportionment Board in House District 95 is the City of Marietta (split on wards). Portions of Marietta Township in House District 95 are non-contiguous to portions of this governmental unit in House District 94 and were not divided by the Ohio Apportionment Board.

III. SECTION 7(A) VIOLATIONS

86. Relators also claim that House Districts 38, 70, 78, 84, 91, 94, and 95 violate Article XI, Section 7(A) of the Ohio Constitution because the boundary lines

should be drawn so as to delineate an area containing one or more whole counties. Each of these House Districts, however, contains at least one or more whole counties. And, the division of counties by one district cannot be analyzed in vacuum, but must rather be examined in conjunction with the need to split counties statewide in order to maintain population equality as required by other sections of Article XI.

87. For House District 38, Article XI, Section 10(C) requires both Summit and Stark County to have a specified number of whole house districts within county boundaries and one district that contains the remainder. The "narrow" strip of land is contiguous, is the boundary of the political subdivision itself (Norton), and is the exact "strip of land" used in the 2001 Apportionment Board plan to connect then House District 41 with itself through the area where Norton and Barberton meet in SW Summit County. A true and accurate copy of maps comparing 2011 House District 38 to 2001 House District 41 is attached as Exhibit 85.

88. In House District 70, pursuant to Article XI, Section 7(A), Ashland County is whole. Additionally, Article XI, Section 10(C) requires Medina County to be split and the remainder of Medina County to be joined with territory from another county(s) to make a whole House District. Pursuant to Art. XI, Sec. 10(D), the remainder of the district is territory from Holmes County necessary to achieve population targets.

89. In House District 78, pursuant to Article XI, Section 7(A), Hocking and Morgan Counties are whole. Additionally, Article XI, Section 10(C) requires

Fairfield County to be split and the remainder of Fairfield County to be joined with territory from another county(s) to make a whole House District. Pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(D), the remainder of the district is territory from other counties necessary to achieve population targets.

90. In House District 84, pursuant to Article XI, Section 7(A), Mercer County is whole. Pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(D), the remainder of the district is territory from other counties necessary to achieve population targets.

91. In House District 91, Clinton, Highland, and Pike Counties are all whole, pursuant to Article XI, Section 7(A). The remaining territory in Ross County is combined with House District 91 in accordance with Article XI, Section 10(D). Without the addition of Ross County territory in House District 91, the district would be too light in population.

92. In House District 94, Meigs County is whole pursuant to Article XI, Section 7(A). The remaining territory in Athens, Vinton, and Washington Counties is combined to form a whole House District in accordance with Article XI, Section 10(D).

93. In House District 95, Carroll, Harrison, and Noble Counties are whole pursuant to Article XI, Section 7(A). The remaining territory in Belmont County and Washington County are combined to form a whole House District in accordance with Article XI, Section 10(D).

IV. SECTION 7(D) VIOLATIONS

94. Relators' claim that House Districts 60, 61, 84, and 91 violate Article XI, Section (D)'s requirement that district boundaries should be adopted to the extent reasonably consistent with the prior boundaries. None of these House Districts deviate substantially from the 2001 Ohio Apportionment Plan. Or, if a deviation was made, it was in order to comply with other provisions of Article XI or population requirements.


95. The change in House Districts 60 and 61 helped achieve a more equal population. The former House District 62 had a population deviation of -4.07%; the former House District 63 had a population deviation of 1.48%. New House District 60 has a population deviation of -3.48%; the new House District 61 has a population deviation of 0.89%. This configuration also increased the African American Voting Age percentage in House District 60, and concurrently helped to make Senate District 25 a stronger minority influence district. Also, the shape of new House District 60 (2011 Apportionment) is not substantially different from previous House District 62 (2001 Apportionment). A true and accurate copy of maps of House Districts 62 and 63 from the 2001 Ohio Apportionment Plan compared to House Districts 60 and 61 from the 2011 Apportionment Plan is attached as Exhibit 86. *See also* Amendment B, which demonstrates the newly configured Senate District 25, previously attached as Exhibit 8.

96. A significant portion of former House District 77 remains in new House District 84 – all of Mercer County and a significant portion of Darke County. House districts are formed using specific creating and numbering found in Article XI,


Section 10. House District 84 is a district (as its high number would suggest) that is formed at the end of apportionment using the "leftovers" or in the words of the Ohio Constitution, "the remainder of the state." Because previous territory was already used for other constitutionally mandated purposes, it became more difficult to satisfy Article XI Section 7(D) with these high number districts that are drafted at the end of the process. We were, however, able to retain all of Mercer county and a good portion of Darke County from the 2001 apportionment. A true and accurate copy of maps of House District 77 from the 2001 Apportionment Plan compared to House District 84 from the 2011 Apportionment Plan is attached as Exhibit 87.

97. Former House District 86 from the 2001 Apportionment is almost identical to new House District 91; both plans contain all of Clinton, Highland and Pike counties. The only change is the addition of two townships in Ross County. A true and accurate copy of maps of House District 86 from the 2001 Apportionment Plan compared to House District 91 from the 2011 Apportionment Plan is attached as Exhibit 88.




Caucus Allocation of Funds:

We, the undersigned Co-Chairs of the Legislative Task force on Redistricting, Reapportionment, and Demographic Research, hereby authorize the Legislative Service Commission to pay for expenses submitted to the Task Force in the following manner:

Caucus Allocation of Funds

- (1) Each pair of legislative caucuses is allocated funds for the purchase of hardware, software, physical space, supplies, and/or consulting in support of the redistricting process.
- (2) This authority is limited to \$115,000 for each pair of caucuses (\$57,500 per individual caucus) and is valid for expenses incurred prior to June 30, 2012. The caucuses of each party may choose to split their \$150,000 evenly. *This authority is in addition to the \$150,000 to each joint caucus authorized by the Co-chairs on June 16, 2011.*
- (3) Any expenses submitted for payment by the joint caucuses must be accompanied by a letter to the Director of the Legislative Service Commission signed by the Chiefs of Staff for each joint caucus and documentation of the expense in order to be paid.

Non-Caucus Task Force Expenses

The payment of other expenses incurred by the Task Force will require documentation of the expense and approval of both Co-Chairs.

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CONSULTING AGREEMENT

This consulting agreement ("The Agreement") is made as of the 5th day of August 2011, between the Republican Members of the Legislative Task Force on Redistricting, Reapportionment, and Demographic Research ("The Task Force") and Policy Widgets, LLC, 827 City Park Avenue, Unit B, Columbus, OH 43206 ("Policy Widgets").

WHEREAS, the Task Force is an entity which was created by R.C. 103.51 for the purpose, among other things, of engaging in such research studies and other activities deemed necessary or appropriate in the preparation and formulation of a plan for the next apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly and a plan for the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 103.51(D), Task Force is empowered to engage such experts and technical advisors and fix their compensation, and to obtain such services as are necessary for the Task Force to perform its duties under R.C. 103.51; and,

WHEREAS, the Republican members of the Task Force desire to retain the services of Policy Widgets to aid them in carrying out their duties under R.C. 103.51(D) including but not limited to, the preparation and formulation of a plan for the next apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly, and a plan for the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress, and Policy Widgets agrees to render such services to the Republican Members of the Task Force, on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

The Task Force and Policy Widgets mutually agree as follows:

1. **Consulting Services.** During the term of this agreement, Policy Widgets shall make available Heather N. Mann to render such consulting services as may be needed or requested by the Republican Members of the Task Force to carry out their duties under R.C. 103.51.
2. **Term.** The term of this agreement will commence on August 5, 2011, and shall expire on December 31, 2011, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of this agreement or extended by the Task Force by agreement with Policy Widgets.
3. **Consulting Payments.** In consideration of the services to be performed by Policy Widgets pursuant to this agreement, The Task Force agrees to pay Policy Widgets the total sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) payable as follows: forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) on August 22, 2011, and thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) payable on October 17, 2011. Further, should litigation be commenced challenging the redistricting plan passed by the General Assembly, the reapportionment plan adopted by the Apportionment Board, or any similar litigation pertaining to the duties in this contract, Policy Widgets shall be paid an additional thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000).
4. **Expense Reimbursement.** During the term of this agreement, Policy Widgets shall be entitled to reimbursement of all reasonable and necessary travel and lodging expenses incurred by Policy Widgets in connection with Policy Widget's performance of the consulting expenses hereunder, provided that Policy Widgets submits to the Task Force


invoices or other documentary verifications of such expenses. The determination of whether any such expenses submitted by Policy Widgets are reasonable and necessary shall be within the sole discretion of the Task Force; provided, however, that the Task Force shall not deny reimbursing Policy Widgets for any properly verified expenses that the Task Force approved in advance of such reimbursement. The Task Force shall provide parking access to Policy Widgets, the use of which shall be limited to the purpose of benefiting the Task Force in the performance of statutory duties.

5. **Other contractual obligations.** Commencing on August 1, 2011, and continuing through October 31, 2011, Policy Widgets shall not engage or hold any other contracts for consulting services related to the General Assembly in the state of Ohio.
6. **Independent Contractor.** The Task Force and Policy Widgets expressly acknowledge and agree that the consulting services to be provided by Policy Widgets under this agreement shall be performed as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee to the Task Force or the Republican Members of the Task Force. The parties expressly acknowledge and agree with respect to any payments made to Policy Widgets hereunder, Task Force will not: (i) withhold any federal F.I.C.A. or other federal, state or local taxes; or (ii) contribute to any applicable workers' compensation, unemployment or any other state or federal programs. Further, Policy Widgets agrees that it has no right to bind the Task Force, or the Republican Members, to any legal commitments to third parties.
7. **Indemnification.** The Task Force shall indemnify and hold harmless Policy Widgets including Heather N. Mann, against any and all liability insofar as such liability arises out of or is based upon any plan for apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly or the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress, or the formulation or creation of any such plan or for any such matter that the Republican Members of the Task Force use the services of Policy Widgets. For this purpose, liability shall mean any: (i) judgments, damages, costs, charges, expenses, or other liabilities imposed by any court, administrative agency, or other governmental authority in any executive, legislative, judicial, regulatory, or administrative action, suit, or other proceeding, including any appeals, (ii) costs, charges, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys fees, filing fees, posting of bond, etc.) reasonably incurred in connection of the defense against any such liabilities, in any such action, suit, or other proceeding; and (iii) costs, charges, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys fees) reasonably incurred in connection with investigation or defense of any claim made or threatened (whether or not made or resulting in any action, suit, or other proceeding.) The indemnification from liability as discussed in this section shall continue in full beyond the end of this Agreement on December 31, 2011.
8. **Termination.** The engagement of Policy Widgets by the Task Force under this agreement shall terminate automatically upon and in the event of death, disability, termination or employment, or other removal or separation of Heather N. Mann as a representative of Policy Widgets during the term hereof. In the event of termination of Policy Widget's engagement, prior to the expiration of the term of this Agreement, Policy Widget's compensation shall be prorated to the date of such termination and no further compensation or expense reimbursements shall be due or paid, but Policy Widgets will still have right to indemnification in Section 7.

9. **Assignment.** Without the written consent of the Republican Members of the Task Force, Policy Widgets shall have no right to assign or otherwise transfer any rights created under this Agreement. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, Task Force and Policy Widgets and their respective successors, personal representatives, executors, administrators and assigns.
10. **State Property.** All equipment, documents, and data purchased or created with Task Force funds shall remain the joint property of the House and Senate Republican Caucuses upon completion of the term of this contract, and shall be transferred to the custody of the House or Senate Republican Caucus upon approval of the Republican Members of the Task Force.
11. **Confidentiality.** Policy Widgets shall not disclose or use, without appropriate authorization by the Republican Members of the Task Force, any information acquired by Policy Widgets in the course of its contractual duties with the Task Force that is confidential because of statutory provisions, or that has been clearly designated to Policy Widgets as confidential when that confidential designation is warranted because of the status of the proceedings or the circumstances under which the information was received and preserving its confidentiality is necessary to the proper conduct of government business.
12. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement, together with any attachments hereto, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all written or oral prior agreements and understandings between the parties.







User Notes on Plan Geography

Part A. General Overview

1. To assist users in their review of the legislative district plan, the plan geography is being provided in different formats. These include a geographic data file known as a shape file and a tabular data file known as an assignment file. The geographic file includes the boundaries for each district. The tabular data file includes one record for the lowest level of geography used to create the plan and the district to which it is assigned.
2. Users with Geographic Information Systems (GIS) software may note a handful of instances in which the appearance of the geography assigned to each district may not match the legal boundaries. Notes follow on these instances below.
3. As a general caveat, whatever the geographic representation might appear to be when the legislative plan is viewed via any software, the controlling document as to the status of any geography is the legal definitions as submitted by the Joint Secretaries to the Ohio Apportionment Board. Those definitions can be found in this document.
4. Any geographic area of the state not specifically named in this legal definition for House and Senate Districts that is wholly contained within the boundaries of a district but not contiguous to any district boundary, is assigned to that district. Any geographic area of the state not specifically named in this legal definition that is contiguous to any district boundary is assigned to that district with which it has the longest continuous boundary. If two or more boundaries are of equal length, the area is assigned to the district with less population. All districts are contiguous including those that are contiguous only by bodies of water.

Part B. Geographic Database

The underlying geographic database used to create plans for legislative districts was developed by the Urban Center at Cleveland State University (CSU) in conjunction with the Voinovich Center at Ohio University (OU) as part of the project to develop the 2010 Ohio Common and Unified Redistricting Database (OCURD). CSU was selected by bipartisan action by the co-chairs of the Ohio Legislative Task Force on Redistricting, Reapportionment and Demographic Research. The lowest level of geography in this database is not the census block but the split census block.

1. The overall purpose of the project was to accommodate for the fact that many census blocks contain portions of multiple higher levels of geography, such as a precinct or a municipality. In geographic terms, these are known as 'split' units because they did not nest into the higher levels of geography. The project also enabled the creation of geographic layers for wards (which were not part of the census geographic products) and precincts that more closely reflect the boundaries used in the 2008 and 2010 elections.
2. To create a geographic system that allowed for topological integrity, the OCURD project used the boundaries of the higher levels of geography as overlays and assigned the underlying census block, or portions thereof, to each of the higher levels. When the higher level geography crossed the census block, a new geographic unit was created

- known as a split block. It is this 'block split' layer of geography that was the lowest level of geography from which the legislative districts were created.
3. Another goal of the OCURD project was to estimate the population in each portion of the split blocks. The project researched several means by which this could be accomplished and chose a method based upon the length of the streets in each such block. Because the population was estimated for each portion, the number of persons was not rounded to a whole person and thus some fractional numbers will be found.
 4. Another issue arose as the OCURD database was being used by the Joint Secretaries of the Ohio Apportionment Board to create legislative plans. This issue relates to the fact that many of the higher levels of geography, notably municipalities, wards, and precincts, contain multiple pieces of territory that are separated by distances short and long. In geographic terms, these are known as 'non-contiguous areas' (NCA) because there is some other land or water between the pieces. There are two types of NCAs: those that are not contiguous because they are islands surrounded by water and those that are not contiguous because they are legally or technically a portion of a geographic unit but surrounded by other land-based geographic units. Examples of the first type are the islands off the coast of Lake Erie. Examples of the second type abound in the state.
 5. In most cases, the multi-part units are combined for geographic representation in GIS software. In geographic terms, these are known as 'shapes' and are assigned to a district as one unit, even though there may be separate estimates of population for the blocks that comprise the higher level unit. Because they are combined as an entire shape they can only be assigned to one district by the GIS software used for the redistricting phase of the apportionment process. The software used by the Board to undertake this process was Maptitude for Redistricting (MTR) by Caliper Corporation.
 6. Requirements of the Ohio Constitution relate to both creating districts from contiguous territory and the maintenance of political subdivision boundaries. Therefore, making use of a multi-part area as the boundary of a district could present a situation in which a political subdivision would be split and a district would be created using non-contiguous territory.
 7. Whatever the geographic representation of the GIS software, the controlling document as to the status of any geography is the legal definition as adopted by the Apportionment Board.
 8. Because some areas in the higher geographic levels are multi-part units the software flagged some districts as being non-contiguous. Notes on these situations follow.

Part C. Notes on Specific Districts:

The following areas include districts that were designated by the Maptitude software as having some non-contiguous areas:

1. District 38—Stark County. Block 391517147013085 is split into two pieces including portions of precincts 151ANY & 151AEB. The portion in 151ANY contains no population and is a part of district 49. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal definition.
2. District 46—Lucas County. Several islands are located off the Lake Erie coast but are portions of Jerusalem Township. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal definition.
3. District 48—Stark County. Block 391517123002009 is split into three pieces including portions of precincts 151ACD, 151AME, and 151ANG. Each of these portions contains

no population. The triangular portion at the lower south east of the block is a part of district 49. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal definition.

4. District 55—Lorain County. Several islands are located off the Lake Erie coast but are portions of Avon Lake City. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal definition.
5. District 83—Hardin and Logan Counties. There is one unit in the 'Block Split' layer, 390650007003086091AAR, that is unassigned in the map. It contains no population and is surrounded by district 83. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal description.
6. District 88—Sandusky County. One island is located in Sandusky Bay but is a portion of Riley Township. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal definition.
7. District 89—Ottawa County. This district has three components: the portion above Sandusky Bay; the portion below Sandusky Bay; and several islands off the Lake Erie coast. See the item 4 in Part A and the legal definition.



This document is also included on the CDs.

As I, and other representatives of the multiple Ohio organizations which are part of our coalition, have explained in detail during testimony at the regional apportionment board hearings, the plans drafted by Mike Fortner and Tim Clarke were the two highest scoring plans during our nonpartisan competition which allowed private citizens to create state legislative districts using the same census and election data being used by the Apportionment Board. These plans were scored using mathematical formulas to measure nonpartisan redistricting criteria: preserving county boundaries, compactness, competitiveness, and representational fairness.

On behalf of the League of Women Voters of Ohio, Ohio Citizen Action, and 23 other Ohio organizations, I urge the Board to use these maps as the basis for Ohio's new state legislative districts. This is an opportunity for the Board to take a leadership role in doing away with politics as usual and instead creating districts in a nonpartisan manner which benefits the public rather than the politicians.


Mike Fortner – Senate – Franklin County






Tim Clarke – House – Cuyahoga County






Tim Clarke – Senate – Cuyahoga County







Amendment A - Recoupling of Cuyahoga County Senate districts



Southeast Ohio Modified House Districts






Ohio House Districts As Amended by Joint Secretaries' Amendment A September 28, 2011







Representative Williams' Statement on the Apportionment Board Meeting

COLUMBUS- State Representative Sandra Williams (D-Cleveland) released the following statement today on the amendment that was ultimately rejected by the Apportionment Board yesterday:

"I support revising the makeup of Senate District 21 to consist of House Districts 9, 10 and 11, a change that was offered during the reapportionment hearing on September 28th.

The change, ultimately not accepted in the hearing yesterday, would have settled any Voting Rights Act concerns in the 21st Senate District.

As it stands today, Senate District 21 would be difficult for an African American to win. Since 1967 when first represented by State Sen. M. Morris Jackson, an African American has always represented what is now Senate District 21. Today Senate District 21 encompasses primarily the Eastside of the City of Cleveland, which is heavily African American, and the elected Representatives and Senators should reflect that demographic makeup.

I will continue to advocate that Senate District 21 include House Districts 9, 10 and 11. I urge the members of the Apportionment Board to take immediate action and reconsider the amendment."

This letter offers advice on the present redistricting of General Assembly seats. According to the statutory mandates of the Ohio Commission on Hispanic and Latino Affairs found in Ohio Revised Code §121, the Commission is required to advise the legislature on matters affecting Ohio Latinos. On behalf of the Board, the Commission advises that the Apportionment Board protect the integrity of the two largest concentrations of Latinos in Ohio – in Lorain County and close by western Cuyahoga County. OCHLA urges the Apportionment Board to keep them intact in their respective Ohio House districts.

These areas are home to some of the oldest and best-established Latino communities in Ohio. According to the 2010 Census, fully 25.2% of residents in the city of Lorain, Ohio are Latinos. In 2000 the figure was only 21%. Lorain's Latinos are predominantly of Puerto Rican descent, and the city has an old, integrated and established Latino community. Lorain's City Council President, Joel Arredondo, as well as its elected Representative to the Ohio House of Representatives – Dan Ramos – are Latinos. The Chief of Lorain's police, Celestino Rivera, is also Latino. Despite the age and success of the community, however, Lorain's Latinos still face issues that differ from those their African-American, Asian or White neighbors. Immigration is a key concern for the community, and the community faces achievement gaps in education as well as access and equity gaps in health and employment.

Cleveland's Latino population also grew significantly in the last decade. While the city lost 17% of its population over the last 10 years, more than 5,000 Hispanics moved into the city. Cleveland's near west side is the traditional Puerto Rican neighborhood in the city. It shares much in common historically and culturally with the Latino community in Lorain. While this is an old and well-established community, much of the growth of Cleveland's Latino community from the last decade is from Mexico and Central America. In fact, Mexicans now make up the second largest country of origin for Cuyahoga County Latinos. While the populations have shifted and become less monolithic in national origin, the challenges facing Cleveland's Puerto Ricans are similar to those facing the newer immigrant communities there.

While neither community can support a majority in an Ohio House of Representatives district, both can influence elections if the integrity of their communities is preserved. Preserving them would maximize access to the political process for a rapidly growing minority population.

Redistricting is an incredibly potent tool for granting and restricting access to politics. The Ohio Commission on Hispanic/Latino Affairs works hard to increase Latino engagement with Ohio's government and civil society. The central message is *always* the importance of voting as the heart of civic engagement. Dividing these communities between two or more districts would dilute the voting strength of a marginalized minority – and undermine the Commission's efforts to mainstream Ohio's Latinos. This minority is growing very quickly, and it is in Ohio's best interest to allow them the access they deserve in harnessing their growing political clout.
