## CONSULTING AGREEMENT

This consulting agreement ("the Agreement") is made as of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 2011, between the Republican Members of the Legislative Task Force on Redistricting, Reapportionment, and Demographic Research ("The Task Force") and Capital Advantage, LLC, 5732 Springburn Drive, Dublin, OH 43017 ("Capital Advantage").


WHEREAS, the Task Force is an entity which was created by R.C. 103.51 for the purpose, among other things, of engaging in such research studies and other activities deemed necessary or appropriate in the preparation and formulation of a plan for the next apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly and a plan for the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 103.51(D), Task Force is empowered to engage such experts and technical advisors and fix their compensation, and to obtain such services as are necessary for the Task Force to perform its duties under R.C. 103.51; and,

WHEREAS, the Republican members of the Task Force desire to retain the services of Capital Advantage to aid them in carrying out their duties under RC 103.51(D) including but not limited to, the preparation and formulation of a plan for the next apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly, and a plan for the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress, and Capital Advantage agrees to render such services to the Republican Members of the Task Force, on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

The Task Force and Capital Advantage mutually agree as follows:

1. **Consulting Services.** During the term of this agreement, Capital Advantage shall make available Raymond E. DiRossi to render such consulting services as may be needed or requested by the Republican Members of the Task Force to carry out their duties under R.C. 103.51.
2. **Term.** The term of this agreement will commence on August 1, 2011, and shall expire on December 31, 2011, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of this agreement or extended by the Task Force by agreement with Capital Advantage.
3. **Consulting Payments.** In consideration of the services to be performed by Capital Advantage pursuant to this agreement, The Task Force agrees to pay Capital Advantage the total sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) payable as follows forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) on August 22, 2011, and thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) payable on October 17, 2011. Further, should litigation be commenced challenging the redistricting plan passed by the General Assembly, the reapportionment plan adopted by the Apportionment Board, or any similar litigation pertaining to the duties in this contract, Capital Advantage shall be paid an additional thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000).
4. **Expense Reimbursement.** During the term of this agreement, Capital Advantage shall be entitled to reimbursement of all reasonable and necessary travel and lodging expenses incurred by Capital Advantage in connection with Capital Advantage's performance of the consulting expenses hereunder, provided that Capital Advantage submits to the Task Force




invoices or other documentary verifications of such expenses. The determination of whether any such expenses submitted by Capital Advantage are reasonable and necessary shall be within the sole discretion of the Task Force; provided, however, that the Task Force shall not deny reimbursing Capital Advantage for any properly verified expenses that the Task Force approved in advance of such reimbursement. The Task Force shall provide parking access to Capital Advantage, the use of which shall be limited to the purpose of benefiting the Task Force in the performance of statutory duties.

5. **Other contractual obligations.** Commencing on August 1, 2011, and continuing through October 31, 2011, Capital Advantage shall not engage or hold any other contracts for consulting services related to the General Assembly in the state of Ohio.
6. **Independent Contractor.** The Task Force and Capital Advantage expressly acknowledge and agree that the consulting services to be provided by Capital Advantage under this agreement shall be performed as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee to the Task Force or the Republican Members of the Task Force. The parties expressly acknowledge and agree with respect to any payments made to Capital Advantage hereunder, Task Force will not: (i) withhold any federal F.I.C.A. or other federal, state or local taxes; or (ii) contribute to any applicable workers' compensation, unemployment or any other state or federal programs. Further, Capital Advantage agrees that it has no right to bind the Task Force, or the Republican Members, to any legal commitments to third parties.
7. **Indemnification.** The Task Force shall indemnify and hold harmless Capital Advantage including Raymond E. DiRossi, against any and all liability insofar as such liability arises out of or is based upon any plan for apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly or the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress, or the formulation or creation of any such plan or for any such matter that the Republican Members of the Task Force use the services of Capital Advantage. For this purpose, liability shall mean any: (i) judgments, damages, costs, charges, expenses, or other liabilities imposed by any court, administrative agency, or other governmental authority in any executive, legislative, judicial, regulatory, or administrative action, suit, or other proceeding, including any appeals, (ii) costs, charges, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys fees, filing fees, posting of bond, etc.) reasonably incurred in connection of the defense against any such liabilities, in any such action, suit, or other proceeding; and (iii) costs, charges, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys fees) reasonably incurred in connection with investigation or defense of any claim made or threatened (whether or not made or resulting in any action, suit, or other proceeding.) The indemnification from liability as discussed in this section shall continue in full beyond the end of this Agreement on December 31, 2011.
8. **Termination.** The engagement of Capital Advantage by the Task Force under this agreement shall terminate automatically upon and in the event of death, disability, termination or employment, or other removal or separation of Raymond E. DiRossi as a representative of Capital Advantage during the term hereof. In the event of termination of Capital Advantage's engagement, prior to the expiration of the term of this Agreement, Capital Advantage's compensation shall be prorated to the date of such termination and no further compensation or expense reimbursements shall be due or paid, but Capital Advantage will still have right to indemnification in Section 7.


9. **Assignment.** Without the written consent of the Republican Members of the Task Force, Capital Advantage shall have no right to assign or otherwise transfer any rights created under this Agreement. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, Task Force and Capital Advantage and their respective successors, personal representatives, executors, administrators and assigns.
10. **State Property.** All equipment, documents, and data purchased or created with Task Force funds shall remain the joint property of the House and Senate Republican Caucuses upon completion of the term of this contract, and shall be transferred to the custody of the House or Senate Republican Caucus upon approval of the Republican Members of the Task Force.
11. **Confidentiality.** Capital Advantage shall not disclose or use, without appropriate authorization by the Republican Members of the Task Force, any information acquired by Capital Advantage in the course of its contractual duties with the Task Force that is confidential because of statutory provisions, or that has been clearly designated to Capital Advantage as confidential when that confidential designation is warranted because of the status of the proceedings or the circumstances under which the information was received and preserving its confidentiality is necessary to the proper conduct of government business.
12. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement, together with any attachments hereto, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all written or oral prior agreements and understandings between the parties.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, the parties agree to the above terms and warrant that they have the authority to bind the parties.

**Chapter 011-1. Meetings**

**011-1-03. Open meetings**

All meetings and public hearings of the 2011 apportionment board shall be held in accordance with the Sunshine Law, section 121.22 of the Revised Code and pursuant to rule 011-1-01 of the Administrative Code, as amended.

INITIAL APPORTIONMENT BOARD MEETING SCRIPT

**I. Call to Order**

GOVERNOR KASICH: Pursuant to Article 11, Section 1 of the Ohio Constitution, I hereby call to order this meeting of the 2011 Board of Apportioning Persons. There is a quorum of members present, but for the record, would each member of the Board please indicate their presence by stating their name.

*[Members state names and titles]*

This meeting is called pursuant to Article II, Section 1 of the Ohio Constitution, which requires that after each decennial census, the Ohio Board of Apportioning persons – including the Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of State, and two persons selected by the leadership of the General Assembly convenes between August 1 and October 1 of the year the census figures are released to establish the district lines of the Ohio General Assembly. Article 11 of the Constitution governs the procedures for this apportionment, and we will therefore proceed under its provisions.

**II. Present Indicia of Office and Letters of Appointment**

GOVERNOR KASICH: Members have been provided with a copy of the proposed agenda for this meeting, which was distributed in advance. The first item of business is for the members of the Board to verify their membership on the Board by presenting their letters of appointment, in the case of legislative apportioning persons, and oaths of office in the case of other members.

We will now receive these documents. I would like to indicate for the record that I have the certificates of office for Secretary of State Husted, Auditor David Yost, and myself as Governor. I also have a letters from House Speaker Bill Batchelder, Senate President Tom Niehaus, Senate Minority Leader Capri Cafaro, and House Minority Leader Armond Budish, choosing and appointing Leader Budish and President Niehaus to serve on this Board.

We now have received the appropriate documentation from each member, and it all appears to be in order.

**III. Election of Chair of the Apportionment Board**

GOVERNOR KASICH: The next item on the agenda is the selection of a chair.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Governor, I move that Governor Kasich be named chair of the



Apportionment Board.

GOVERNOR KASICH: We have a motion. Is there a second?

AUDITOR YOST: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Auditor Yost seconds. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [*all say aye*]. Those opposed? Motion is carried, I will serve as chair.

#### IV. Selection of Secretary of the Apportionment Board

GOVERNOR KASICH: The next item on the agenda is for the selection of a secretary to the Board of Apportioning persons. The Secretary will keep the minutes, call the roll, and record all votes and maintain custody of all the records of the Apportionment Board, including the proposed plan to be filed with the Board. I will now entertain a motion for secretary.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that [*name*] be named Secretary of the Apportionment Board.

GOVERNOR KASICH: We have a motion. Is there a second?

AUDITOR YOST: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Auditor Yost seconds the motion. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? Is there any discussion of the nomination? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [*all say aye*]. Those opposed? Motion is carried, [*name*] will serve as Secretary. I will now give [*name*], the custodian of the records, the documentation provided to me.

#### V. Election of Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board

GOVERNOR KASICH: The next item on the agenda is the selection of a vice chair to the Board of Apportioning persons. I nominate Auditor Yost to serve as vice chair of the 2011 Apportionment Board. Is there a second?

SECRETARY HUSTED: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Secretary Husted seconds the motion. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? Is there any discussion of the nomination? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [*all say aye*]. Those opposed? If not, will the Secretary please call the role.

SECRETARY: For the selection of Auditor Yost as Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board, [calls roll]. Auditor Yost is selected Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board by a vote of X-X.

#### VI. Announcement of Attorney Representation

GOVERNOR KASICH: Historically, the Attorney General has represented the Board and all persons serving on the Board. Attorney General Mike DeWine has appointed Mark Braden to be here today to be available to the Board. I would like to ask Mr. Braden to identify himself on the record.

MARK BRADEN: Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board, I am Mark Braden, Counsel to the Board.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Thank you, and welcome.

#### VII. Appointment of Official Court Reporter

GOVERNOR KASICH: At this point, given the official and historic nature of our proceedings, we need to appoint an official court reporter for the proceedings of the Apportionment Board. For the record, I'd like to ask our court reporter, who is here from the firm of Armstrong & Okey to please identify herself.

REPORTER: My name is Karen Gibson, court reporter with Armstrong & Okey.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Accordingly, I will now entertain a motion to appoint an official court reporter for these proceedings.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the firm of Armstrong & Okey be the official court reporter for the 2011 Apportionment Board and that said court reporter please prepare and provide each member of the Board a copy of the transcript of each of our meetings.

AUDITOR YOST: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Auditor Yost seconds the motion. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? Is there any discussion of the nomination? If not, all in favor signify by saying aye [all say aye]. Those opposed? If not, will the Secretary please call the roll.

SECRETARY: For the appointment of Armstrong and Okey as official court reporter for the 2011 Apportionment Board, [calls roll]. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Thank you.

### VIII. Adoption of Rules and Procedures

GOVERNOR KASICH: This brings us to our next agenda item, which is the adoption of the rules of the 2011 Apportionment Board. All the members should have a copy of the proposed rules which I provided to each of you in advance of today's meeting. These proposed rules are, in essence, a revised version of the rules of the 2011 Apportionment Board which are on file with the Legislative Service Commission. Our intention is to vote on the rules as a block unless there is an amendment. At this time I would entertain a motion regarding the rules.

*[If there is n motion to adopt the proposed rules as a block]*

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that we vote to adopt Rules 1-12.

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to adopt Rules 1-12 *[calls roll]*. The motion carries X-X.

*[If there is a motion to amend the proposed rules]*

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion?

MEMBER: Move to amend.

GOVERNOR KASICH: *[name]* moves to amend. Please describe your amendment.

*Member proceeds to describe amendment.*

GOVERNOR KASICH: The amendment has been moved.

MEMBER: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: *[calls roll]*. The motion to amend passes X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Is there further discussion on the proposed rules as amended? If not, will the secretary please call the roll on the motion to adopt the proposed rules.

SECRETARY: *[calls roll]*. The motion to adopt rules 1-12 as amended passes X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules have been adopted. I instruct the Secretary of the Board to certify and file these rules forthwith as prescribed by the Ohio Revised Code.

#### IX. Adoption of Public Hearing Schedule

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules we have just adopted provide for a series of public hearings around the state to receive public input and comment on the apportionment plan. At this point I would entertain a motion to establish a schedule of these public hearings.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, a proposed schedule had earlier been distributed stating the times and places for eleven public hearings to be held in various locations around the state from August 22 to August 26, 2011. I would move that we adopt the proposed schedule as the schedule of public hearings as required by our rules.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Is there a second?

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to adopt the public schedule of hearings, *[calls roll]*. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The Secretary is instructed to make the schedule available to the press and the public.

#### X. Adoption of public records policy

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules also call for the Apportionment Board to adopt a public records pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 149.43. A proposed public records policy was distributed to members earlier and is in your folders. Do I have a motion on the proposed policy?

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board adopt the proposed public records policy.

AUDITORA YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the

Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to adopt the public records policy, [*calls roll*]. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The Secretary is instructed to make the records policy available to the public and the press.

#### XI. Designation of place for public review of proposed apportionment plan

GOVERNOR KASICH: At this time, I would like to ask Secretary Husted to provide us with an overview of the Secretary's redistricting website.

SECRETARY HUSTED: [*discusses website*].

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules call for the apportionment board to designate a place or places where the public may review the plans of apportionment that are filed with the Board. Is there a motion on the designation of a place for public review of submitted plans?

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board designate a website with the address of [www.reshapeohio.org](http://www.reshapeohio.org) and a physical space adjacent to the Ohio House of Representatives Chambers, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Statehouse, Columbus Ohio 43215 where the public may review the plans that were submitted to the Board.

AUDITORA YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to designate the place where the public may view apportionment plans, [*calls roll*]. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The Secretary is instructed to make the location and website as the designated places for public review of plans available to the press.

#### XII. Establishing time, date, and place of next meeting

GOVERNOR KASICH: At this time I will entertain a motion to establish the date and place of the next meeting of the 2011 Apportionment Board.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the next meeting of the Board be set for

Monday, Sept. 26, 2011 at 9AM in the Ohio Senate Finance Hearing Room.

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to set the date and location of the next Apportionment Board meeting for Monday, Sept. 26, 2011 at 9AM in the Ohio Senate Finance Hearing Room. The motion carries X-X.

### XIII. Adjourn

GOVERNOR KASICH: Any further business to come before the 2011 Apportionment Board? If not, I will entertain a motion to recess the Board until Monday, Sept. 26, 2011 at 9AM.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, so moved.

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

## APPORTIONMENT BOARD REGIONAL HEARINGS SCRIPT

### I. Call to Order & Introduction of Panel

**SECRETARY:** We now call to order the [*name location*] regional hearing of the Ohio Apportionment Board.

As people arrive who would like to testify, we would ask that you please fill out a witness slip on the table and provide them to the Lisa or Kyle [*indicate staff*].

The 2011 Apportionment Board, which is responsible for drawing districts for the Ohio Senate and the Ohio House of Representatives, held its initial meeting on August 4, 2011. At the meeting, the Board adopted rules which require a series of public hearings throughout the state to gather public input and comment and appointed [*Heather Mann/Ray DiRossi*] and I as Joint Secretaries of the Board.

Seeing that the Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board (State Auditor Dave Yost) is here with us today - I will ask if Auditor Yost would preside over this regional hearing.

[*Hands gavel to Auditor*]

### II. Opening Statement

#### AUDITOR YOST:

Thank you. Will the Secretary please call the roll, and during this attendance roll call would each member please state their name and which office they represent, if they are present as a designee.

[*Secretary calls the roll*]

We would first like to thank [*university name and contacts*] for hosting us today, as well as Lisa Griffin who coordinated arrangements for these hearings.

I would like to remind everyone that the purpose of the hearing is to gather information, comments, and input regarding the upcoming reconfiguration of the House and Senate district lines. The Apportionment Board and the panel before you is **not** responsible for re-drawing Ohio's congressional districts. New congressional districts will be established by the state legislature as a bill that will be voted upon by the members of the Ohio House of Representatives and the Ohio Senate. That bill then would have to be signed or vetoes by the Governor. We would ask all of the witnesses limit their comments and testimony to the matter before the Apportionment Board - that being the Ohio House and Ohio Senate districts.

We're here to listen today. We're not here to debate you; we're not here to debate one another. We're here to get input from Ohioans on the apportionment process and how it impacts your communities and your representation in the Ohio General Assembly.

Today - we have a limited amount of time for the hearing (*if applicable -- we are also scheduled to have a hearing later today in (insert location)*), and we want to give everyone a full opportunity to offer their input. We are scheduled here for two hours, and we may ask witnesses to limit their testimony in the interest of time and out of courtesy for other persons who wish to address the panel.

In Ohio, as in most states, legislative reapportionment occurs in the years ending in "1", which are also the years in which the federal census figures are released by the U.S. Department of Commerce. The census figures released this year indicate that Ohio has a population of 11,536,504 people. That means that ideally each of the 99 House districts should contain 116,530 people, and each of the 33 Senate districts should contain 349,590 people.

Anyone who has researched, or undertaken the actual drawing of legislative districts, knows that this process involves far more than somebody putting roughly the same number of people in each district. In Ohio, the General Assembly districts must conform to traditional redistricting principles and other requirements that are embodied in Article XI of the Ohio Constitution. Article XI contains specific rules governing the construction of these districts, including several layers of sometimes complex requirements. In addition to the Ohio Constitution, the Board must also comply with all applicable federal laws, most notably the Voting Rights Act.

Because these hearings are being held for the purpose of receiving your input in the process, we are not going to go over the details of the law. However, copies of Article XI of the Ohio Constitution, as well as other information such as population changes, the apportionment process, and how the public may submit plans are available for you at the table. We encourage you to pick these up and review them as they are the same guidelines the board has to follow as it draws legislative districts.

A few other items before we begin: these proceedings will be transcribed by a court reporter so that the Board in its deliberations may consider things that are said here today – so please speak clearly and loud enough for the panel and the audience members and our court reporter to hear. If you have written testimony, please submit it to our staff so that it may be included in the official record of the proceeding. We will make sure that all testimony received at the hearing is available on the Secretary of State's website at [www.reshapeohio.org](http://www.reshapeohio.org). As the Secretary / Secretary's designee is here with us today, I would ask for a brief overview of the website at this time.

### III. Witnesses

**AUDITOR:** We will now begin with our first witness here today, Mr./Mrs. [name]. Please state

Speaker Batchelder,

I am very pleased with the new house district I may have the honor of serving (New House District 72) in the future, if elected. Thanks to those who worked on the maps.

While the new areas in HD72 include areas that I have had little or no previous contact with, I'm excited about meeting the fine folks in Coshocton and Muskingum Counties and serving them in the Ohio House.

I write to request reconsideration regarding the assigned areas to new HD72 within Licking County, which I understand would include as the map presently stands the following, to wit:

Townships of Fallsburg, Perry, Hanover, Madison, Hopewell, Bowling Green, Licking, Franklin, Union, Harrison, the Villages of Hanover and Hebron, and the City of Heath.

I am very passionate about representing Southwestern Licking County, an area where I have lived for more than 40 years. My wife makes some light of the fact that we move every 5 or 6 years, but not farther than 5 or 6 miles from our old address. We've actually had seven different addresses in the Pataskala area. We also lived in neighboring Reynoldsburg, to the immediate southwest of Pataskala, for several years where Carolyn and I both taught school and I served on School Board for a short time after leaving the teaching career for industry.

My desire to represent Southwestern Licking County has had a bit of a setback in that I stand to lose Etna Township (out of current HD91) and did not have the City of Pataskala added to new HD72 as I had hoped and asked for. It is important to note that it was Etna Township, along with Harrison, that provided the votes for victory in the 11<sup>th</sup> hour during the 2010 campaign against Dan Dodd.

My enthusiasm for the Southwestern part of Licking County (Etna Township and City of Pataskala) stems from the following facts:

1. My family has lived in the area for more than 40 years.
2. I served as a School Board Member in Southwestern Licking Schools in the 1980's; my wife Carolyn before she retired taught School in all three of the elementary schools in Southwest Licking Schools (including Pataskala) as well as the Middle School; our son, Scott, served as a School Board Member in Southwest Licking until just recently; our daughter, Sallie, taught at the Southwest Licking Middle School before her husband was transferred out of state; we raised all three of our children in the Southwest Licking Schools; we have three grandchildren presently attending in those same schools now. Our two daughter-in-laws teach in the Southwestern Licking County schools, too.
3. Our connection with the City of Pataskala is also significant in that we previously lived in the City for 13 years; I've practiced law in Pataskala for over 33 years; my sons now practice law in Pataskala with me; I served as City Law Director from the time Pataskala merged with Lima Township (now the City of Pataskala) until 2002 and saw this new city through its infant stages, codified it's ordinances, created and established its Mayor's court, and attended all council meetings during my term. Presently, our son, Dan, serves on City Council in Pataskala.
4. In addition, our church life is centered around the Pataskala Community. I've been an Elder at Tri-Village Christian Church for more than 40 years, our children were raised and baptized in the church, Carolyn and I, along with other members of the family have been involved as members of the choir, the praise team, Sunday school teachers and members of the church board. The Tri Village Church is located in Harrison Township (within new HD72), but very close to Pataskala. A large part of the congregation lives in Etna Township and the City of Pataskala.
5. Finally, I should mention that because of the many relationships we have established in the Southwest Licking Community (Etna Township and the City of Pataskala) a great deal of our support in both man power (door to door, mailings, fundraisers) and financial aid comes from these two communities.

My suggestion is to remove from proposed HD72 Fallsburg and Madison Townships as well as the City of Heath and add them back to Jay Hottinger's District. These communities are in his present HD 71. Jay attends church and has many contacts in the City of Heath. I have few to none in comparison.

I would then suggest that Etna Township (and portions of Reynoldsburg in Etna Township, Licking County) and the City of Pataskala be added to the proposed HD72.

Essentially, the result would be that the areas in Licking County in new HD72 would be the same as current HD91, except the City of Pataskala would be added. Jay's district would remain the same as it is now, except he would not have the City of Pataskala and those portions of Reynoldsburg in Etna Township. If more population were needed, Franklin Township, which is adjacent to Heath, and/or Perry Township could be added to Jay's district as well.

Maps are attached (A) HD72 as proposed, (B) (Etna & Pataskala added - Fallsbury and Madison removed and (C) like B, Franklin also removed). The un-shaded portions of Licking County are Hottinger's District.

In future elections, the likelihood is that the person who will run for the Hottinger seat will be a person from the Granville/ Newark/Heath area as nearly all of the county's elected officials are from these communities.

As Pataskala grows, having Pataskala and Newark in the same House District will, potentially, cause primary elections in the future as these communities do not relate to one another well. I say this because Republicans in Pataskala and Newark have a long history of a less than copasetic relationship. It is rumored that a western Licking County official may primary a sitting commission from Newark next year. Further, having Heath and Newark in the same district makes more sense from a community identity standpoint, as does keeping Harrison Township, Etna Township and Pataskala together.

I am well aware that my request may be easier said than done, however, I would not be completely satisfied if I had not presented these matters to you. Thank you for your consideration and leadership on this matter.


New District: Same parts of Fairfield, Pickaway, Hocking, and Vinton, plus Morgan, Muskingum (only Blue Rock, Brush Creek, Clay, Harrison, and Meigs Townships) and one township (Trimble) in Athens County.

Phillips district (same except loses Trimble Twp in athens county)

If you do this, then the 71st and 72nd districts and Landis' district would be designated the 31st Senate district, because Licking plus Perry is greater population than the combined Fairfield, Hocking, and (from what I can tell) the part of Pickaway that was in the old 31st District (if I have by chance on Pickaway miscalculated there are two ways to easily fix, but I don't think I have).

Balderson would live in the 20th District. (So would Schaffer, but that's not an issue because he is not a candidate and can serve the remainder of his term even though he doesn't reside in the district.

Obviously, because I do not have access to political index software, I have no idea how this might affect the political balance of the districts. I don't think the Senate will be affected significantly; I am uncertain about Hayes, though for example, I think that St Albans and Granville Twps. (minus Granville city) in the 71st District could be added to the 72nd district to help shore up Hayes if his numbers were to fall.

## Sample Comments for Apportionment Board

The Board must first determine whether a proposed plan complies with the U.S. Constitution, federal statutory provisions and requirements of the Ohio Constitution before debating "policy" considerations.

I believe the plan from the Joint Secretaries does comply with all federal constitutional and statutory requirements.

The Joint Secretaries' sought population equality of the House and Senate districts as required by the Equal Protection Clause of the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment. The total range of population division in the plan is caused by the constant observance of Ohio constitutional policy on the creation of whole county house districts in Article XI, Sec. 9. This policy has been followed without exception since the 1960s. The plans are within the population limits set forth by the U.S. Supreme Court. At least one other plan did not consistently apply the provision allowing the creation of permissive single county districts.

The Secretaries' plan has provided for Ohio's African-American citizens an equal opportunity to elect their preferred candidates of choice. The plan creates more majority-minority non-Hispanic black House and Senate districts than any other proposal presented to the Board. These majority-minority districts were created in complete conformance with Ohio Constitutional redistricting requirements. They are communities of interest which deserve representation under any analysis of traditional redistricting criteria. From the materials received by this Board, I do not believe any of the other plans would provide a greater opportunity for the election of candidates of choice of Ohio's African-American communities.

As recognized by all presenters, every requirement of the Ohio Constitution cannot be observed without exception in both House and Senate plans. Every proposed Senate Plan, including the Secretaries' plan, contains a violation of Article II, Section 11 on Senate districts in northeastern Ohio. The Joint Secretaries' plan does not violate Article 11, Sec. 8 on House districts. Every other proposed plan does violate this Ohio Constitutional provision. This fact alone should prompt this board to reject the other proposed plans and adopt the Secretaries' plan as the one which does the least violence to the Ohio Constitution.

Unlike the drafters of other plans submitted to the Board, this body does not have the option to ignore requirements of the Ohio Constitution.

Unlike some of the plans drafted, the Board does not have the option to ignore requirements of the Ohio Constitution.

The Board does not have the option of ignoring Ohio Constitutional provisions with which it may disagree. Article 11 Section 7 (D) requires a reasonable effort to preserve existing district boundaries and is certainly designed in part for a consideration of incumbency. The Campaign for Accountable Redistricting decided to totally ignore this Constitutional provision, and any consideration of incumbency. In fact, they decided to insert a competitiveness requirement or goal in their plan drafting content.

Whether competitiveness is an important and ever proper consideration and how it is measured is a matter of significant disagreement. It certainly is not a universally recognized requirement, nor even a widely used or accepted goal. Competitiveness as a redistricting requirement was specifically rejected by the voters of this State. The Campaign may get to pick and choose the

criteria for its contests, however the Board is bound by the will of Ohio citizens as expressed in the Ohio Constitution.

The Secretaries' plans were drafted using existing precinct lines—an important cost and administrative consideration for the state. It was not a criteria for the Campaign for Accountable Redistricting contest.

I believe after consideration of compliance with all other legal requirements, it is proper to consider where incumbent members live. They were elected by the voter of their present districts. The Board should not arbitrarily pair members which can be avoided without impairing other important considerations. The Board should reject plans which ignore incumbency totally.

There is some confusion from some testimony provided to the Board on the number of political subdivisions divided by various plans. I would direct interested parties to the user notes on plan geography found in the Secretaries' legal definitions of September 23. The issues addressed in their note undoubtedly explain to great degree the differing analysis. As the Secretaries' testimony from Monday revealed, the fact remain that there are many ways to count county and political subdivision splits. The Secretaries' map splits 15 political subdivisions, five of them major cities (Columbus, Akron, Dayton, Toledo, Cleveland) are major urban areas where the cities are too big to contain single districts. At the ward level, the Secretaries' plan splits 14 wards, while the Democrats caucuses plan splits 41 wards and the Fortner map split over 100 wards.

For these reasons, I will be voting in support of this plan.

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## CONSULTING AGREEMENT

This consulting agreement ("The Agreement") is made as of the 3 day of August 2011, between the Republican Members of the Legislative Task Force on Redistricting, Reapportionment, and Demographic Research ("The Task Force") and Policy Widgets, LLC, 827 City Park Avenue, Unit B, Columbus, OH 43206 ("Policy Widgets").

WHEREAS, the Task Force is an entity which was created by R.C. 103.51 for the purpose, among other things, of engaging in such research studies and other activities deemed necessary or appropriate in the preparation and formulation of a plan for the next apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly and a plan for the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 103.51(D), Task Force is empowered to engage such experts and technical advisors and fix their compensation, and to obtain such services as are necessary for the Task Force to perform its duties under R.C. 103.51; and,

WHEREAS, the Republican members of the Task Force desire to retain the services of Policy Widgets to aid them in carrying out their duties under R.C. 103.51(D) including but not limited to, the preparation and formulation of a plan for the next apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly, and a plan for the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress, and Policy Widgets agrees to render such services to the Republican Members of the Task Force, on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

The Task Force and Policy Widgets mutually agree as follows:

1. **Consulting Services.** During the term of this agreement, Policy Widgets shall make available Heather N. Mann to render such consulting services as may be needed or requested by the Republican Members of the Task Force to carry out their duties under R.C. 103.51.
2. **Term.** The term of this agreement will commence on August 3, 2011, and shall expire on December 31, 2011, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of this agreement or extended by the Task Force by agreement with Policy Widgets.
3. **Consulting Payments.** In consideration of the services to be performed by Policy Widgets pursuant to this agreement, The Task Force agrees to pay Policy Widgets the total sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) payable as follows: forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) on August 22, 2011, and thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) payable on October 17, 2011. Further, should litigation be commenced challenging the redistricting plan passed by the General Assembly, the reapportionment plan adopted by the Apportionment Board, or any similar litigation pertaining to the duties in this contract, Policy Widgets shall be paid an additional thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000).
4. **Expense Reimbursement.** During the term of this agreement, Policy Widgets shall be entitled to reimbursement of all reasonable and necessary travel and lodging expenses incurred by Policy Widgets in connection with Policy Widget's performance of the consulting expenses hereunder, provided that Policy Widgets submits to the Task Force




invoices or other documentary verifications of such expenses. The determination of whether any such expenses submitted by Policy Widgets are reasonable and necessary shall be within the sole discretion of the Task Force; provided, however, that the Task Force shall not deny reimbursing Policy Widgets for any properly verified expenses that the Task Force approved in advance of such reimbursement. The Task Force shall provide parking access to Policy Widgets, the use of which shall be limited to the purpose of benefiting the Task Force in the performance of statutory duties.

5. **Other contractual obligations.** Commencing on August 1, 2011, and continuing through October 31, 2011, Policy Widgets shall not engage or hold any other contracts for consulting services related to the General Assembly in the state of Ohio.
6. **Independent Contractor.** The Task Force and Policy Widgets expressly acknowledge and agree that the consulting services to be provided by Policy Widgets under this agreement shall be performed as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee to the Task Force or the Republican Members of the Task Force. The parties expressly acknowledge and agree with respect to any payments made to Policy Widgets hereunder, Task Force will not: (i) withhold any federal F.I.C.A. or other federal, state or local taxes; or (ii) contribute to any applicable workers' compensation, unemployment or any other state or federal programs. Further, Policy Widgets agrees that it has no right to bind the Task Force, or the Republican Members, to any legal commitments to third parties.
7. **Indemnification.** The Task Force shall indemnify and hold harmless Policy Widgets including Heather N. Mann, against any and all liability insofar as such liability arises out of or is based upon any plan for apportionment of the Ohio General Assembly or the establishment of districts for election of representatives to the United States Congress, or the formulation or creation of any such plan or for any such matter that the Republican Members of the Task Force use the services of Policy Widgets. For this purpose, liability shall mean any: (i) judgments, damages, costs, charges, expenses, or other liabilities imposed by any court, administrative agency, or other governmental authority in any executive, legislative, judicial, regulatory, or administrative action, suit, or other proceeding, including any appeals, (ii) costs, charges, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys fees, filing fees, posting of bond, etc.) reasonably incurred in connection of the defense against any such liabilities, in any such action, suit, or other proceeding; and (iii) costs, charges, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys fees) reasonably incurred in connection with investigation or defense of any claim made or threatened (whether or not made or resulting in any action, suit, or other proceeding.) The indemnification from liability as discussed in this section shall continue in full beyond the end of this Agreement on December 31, 2011.
8. **Termination.** The engagement of Policy Widgets by the Task Force under this agreement shall terminate automatically upon and in the event of death, disability, termination or employment, or other removal or separation of Heather N. Mann as a representative of Policy Widgets during the term hereof. In the event of termination of Policy Widget's engagement, prior to the expiration of the term of this Agreement, Policy Widget's compensation shall be prorated to the date of such termination and no further compensation or expense reimbursements shall be due or paid, but Policy Widgets will still have right to indemnification in Section 7.

9. **Assignment.** Without the written consent of the Republican Members of the Task Force, Policy Widgets shall have no right to assign or otherwise transfer any rights created under this Agreement. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, Task Force and Policy Widgets and their respective successors, personal representatives, executors, administrators and assigns.
10. **State Property.** All equipment, documents, and data purchased or created with Task Force funds shall remain the joint property of the House and Senate Republican Caucuses upon completion of the term of this contract, and shall be transferred to the custody of the House or Senate Republican Caucus upon approval of the Republican Members of the Task Force.
11. **Confidentiality.** Policy Widgets shall not disclose or use, without appropriate authorization by the Republican Members of the Task Force, any information acquired by Policy Widgets in the course of its contractual duties with the Task Force that is confidential because of statutory provisions, or that has been clearly designated to Policy Widgets as confidential when that confidential designation is warranted because of the status of the proceedings or the circumstances under which the information was received and preserving its confidentiality is necessary to the proper conduct of government business.
12. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement, together with any attachments hereto, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all written or oral prior agreements and understandings between the parties.







## INITIAL APPORTIONMENT BOARD MEETING SCRIPT

### I. Call to Order

GOVERNOR KASICH: Pursuant to Article 11, Section 1 of the Ohio Constitution, I hereby call to order this meeting of the 2011 Board of Apportioning Persons. There is a quorum of members present, but for the record, would each member of the Board please indicate their presence by stating their name.

*[Members state names and titles]*

This meeting is called pursuant to Article II, Section 1 of the Ohio Constitution, which requires that after each decennial census, the Ohio Board of Apportioning persons – including the Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of State, and two persons selected by the leadership of the General Assembly convenes between August 1 and October 1 of the year the census figures are released to establish the district lines of the Ohio General Assembly. Article 11 of the Constitution governs the procedures for this apportionment, and we will therefore proceed under its provisions.

### II. Present Indicia of Office and Letters of Appointment

GOVERNOR KASICH: Members have been provided with a copy of the proposed agenda for this meeting, which was distributed in advance. The first item of business is for the members of the Board to verify their membership on the Board by presenting their letters of appointment, in the case of legislative apportioning persons, and oaths of office in the case of other members.

We will now receive these documents. I would like to indicate for the record that I have the certificates of office for Secretary of State Husted, Auditor David Yost, and myself as Governor. I also have a letters from House Speaker Bill Batchelder, Senate President Tom Niehaus, Senate Minority Leader Capri Cafaro, and House Minority Leader Armond Budish, choosing and appointing [*Senator/Representative X and Senator/Representative Y*] to serve on this Board.

We now have received the appropriate documentation from each member, and it all appears to be in order.

### III. Election of Chair of the Apportionment Board

GOVERNOR KASICH: The next item on the agenda is the selection of a chair.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Governor, I move that Governor Kasich be named chair of the

Apportionment Board.

GOVERNOR KASICH: We have a motion. Is there a second?

AUDITOR YOST: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Auditor Yost seconds. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [*all say aye*]. Those opposed? Motion is carried, I will serve as chair.

#### IV. Selection of Secretary of the Apportionment Board

GOVERNOR KASICH: The next item on the agenda is for the selection of a secretary to the Board of Apportioning persons. The Secretary will keep the minutes, call the roll, and record all votes and maintain custody of all the records of the Apportionment Board, including the proposed plan to be filed with the Board. I will now entertain a motion for secretary.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that [*name*] be named Secretary of the Apportionment Board.

GOVERNOR KASICH: We have a motion. Is there a second?

AUDITOR YOST: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Auditor Yost seconds the motion. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? Is there any discussion of the nomination? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [*all say aye*]. Those opposed? Motion is carried, [*name*] will serve as Secretary. I will now give [*name*], the custodian of the records, the documentation provided to me.

#### V. Election of Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board

GOVERNOR KASICH: The next item on the agenda is the selection of a vice chair to the Board of Apportioning persons. I nominate Auditor Yost to serve as vice chair of the 2011 Apportionment Board. Is there a second?

SECRETARY HUSTED: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Secretary Husted seconds the motion. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? Is there any discussion of the nomination? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [*all say aye*]. Those opposed? If not, will the Secretary please call the role.

SECRETARY: For the selection of Auditor Yost as Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board, [calls roll]. Auditor Yost is selected Vice Chair of the Apportionment Board by a vote of X-X.

#### VI. Announcement of Attorney Representation

GOVERNOR KASICH: Historically, the Attorney General has represented the Board and all persons serving on the Board. Attorney General Mike DeWine has appointed Mark Braden to be here today to be available to the Board. I would like to ask Mr. Braden to identify himself on the record.

MARK BRADEN: Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board, I am Mark Braden, Counsel to the Board.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Thank you, and welcome.

#### VII. Appointment of Official Court Reporter

GOVERNOR KASICH: At this point, given the official and historic nature of our proceedings, we need to appoint an official court reporter for the proceedings of the Apportionment Board. Accordingly, I will now entertain a motion to appoint an official court reporter for these proceedings.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the firm of [name] be the official court reporter for the 2001 Apportionment Board and that said court reporter please prepare and provide each member of the Board a copy of the transcript of each of our meetings.

AUDITOR YOST: I second the motion.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Auditor Yost seconds the motion. The nomination has been made and seconded. Are there any other nominations? Is there any discussion of the nomination? If not, all if favor signify by saying aye [all say aye]. Those opposed? If not, will the Secretary please call the roll.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Thank you. For the record, I'd like to ask our court reporter, who is here from the firm of [name], to please identify [his/her]self.

These proposed rules are, in essence, a revised version of the rules of the 2001 Apportionment Board which are on file with the Legislative Service Commission. Our intention is to vote on the rules as a block unless there is an amendment. At this time I would entertain a motion regarding the rules.

*[If there is a motion to adopt the proposed rules as a block]*

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that we vote to adopt Rules X-X.

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to adopt Rules X-X *[calls roll]*. The motion carries X-X.

*[If there is a motion to amend the proposed rules]*

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion?

MEMBER: Move to amend.

GOVERNOR KASICH: *[name]* moves to amend. Please describe your amendment.

*Member proceeds to describe amendment.*

GOVERNOR KASICH: The amendment has been moved.

MEMBER: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: *[calls roll]*. The motion to amend passes X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Is there further discussion on the proposed rules as amended? If not, will the secretary please call the roll on the motion to adopt the proposed rules.

SECRETARY: *[calls roll]*. The motion to adopt rules X-X as amended passes X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules have been adopted. I instruct the Secretary of the Board to certify and file these rules forthwith as prescribed by the Ohio Revised Code.

#### IX. Adoption of Public Hearing Schedule

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules we have just adopted provide for provide for a series of public hearings around the state to receive public input and comment on the apportionment plan. At this point I would entertain a motion to establish a schedule of these public hearings.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, a proposed schedule had earlier been distributed stating the times and places for eleven public hearings to be held in various locations around the state from August 22 to August 26, 2011. I would move that we adopt the proposed schedule as the schedule of public hearings as required by our rules.

GOVERNOR KASICH: Is there a second?

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to adopt the public schedule of hearings, [*calls roll*]. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The Secretary is instructed to make the schedule available to the press and the public.

#### X. Adoption of public records policy

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules also call for the Apportionment Board to adopt a public records pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 149.43. A proposed public records policy was distributed to members earlier and is in your folders. Do I have a motion on the proposed policy?

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board adopt the proposed public records policy.

AUDITORA YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to adopt the public records policy, [*calls roll*]. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The Secretary is instructed to make the records policy available to the public and the press.

#### **XI. Designation of place for public review of proposed apportionment plan**

GOVERNOR KASICH: At this time, I would like to ask Secretary Husted to provide us with an overview of the Secretary's redistricting website.

SECRETARY HUSTED: [*discusses website*].

GOVERNOR KASICH: The rules call for the apportionment board to designate a place or places where the public may review the plans of apportionment that are filed with the Board. Is there a motion on the designation of a place for public review of submitted plans?

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board designate a website with the address of [www.reshapeohio.org](http://www.reshapeohio.org) and a physical space adjacent to the Ohio House of Representatives Chambers, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Statehouse, Columbus Ohio 43215 where the public may review the plans that were submitted to the Board.

AUDITORA YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to designate the place where the public may view apportionment plans, [*calls roll*]. The motion carries X-X.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The Secretary is instructed to make the location and website as the designated places for public review of plans available to the press.

#### **XII. Establishing time, date, and place of next meeting**

GOVERNOR KASICH: At this time I will entertain a motion to establish the date and place of the next meeting of the 2011 Apportionment Board.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, I move that the next meeting of the Board be set for Monday, Sept. 26, 2011 at 9AM in the Ohio Senate Finance Hearing Room.

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion? If none, the Secretary will call the roll.

SECRETARY: On the motion to set the date and location of the next Apportionment Board meeting for Monday, Sept. 26, 2011 at 9AM in the Ohio Senate Finance Hearing Room. The motion carries X-X.

### XIII. Adjourn

GOVERNOR KASICH: Any further business to come before the 2011 Apportionment Board? If not, I will entertain a motion to recess the Board until Monday, Sept. 26, 2011 at 9AM.

SECRETARY HUSTED: Mr. Chairman, so moved.

AUDITOR YOST: Second.

GOVERNOR KASICH: The motion has been made and seconded. All in favor? Opposed? Thank you, the 2011 Apportionment Board is adjourned.



APPORTIONMENT BOARD MEETING SCRIPT  
SEPTEMBER 26, 2011 (TESTIMONY ON PLANS)

I. Call to Order & Introduction of Panel

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** The meeting will now come to order. Pursuant to notice, I now reconvene the 2011 Ohio Apportionment Board. The Secretary will call the roll.

**SECRETARY:** [calls roll]

[Members state names and titles]

**SECRETARY:** All members are present; we have a quorum.

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** Pursuant to the rules adopted by the Board on August 4, 2011, the Secretary have circulated for review, to all members, transcripts from our initial meeting on August 4<sup>th</sup> and the regional hearings held August 22 – 26. At this time, I will ask for a motion to dispense with the reading and adopt these transcripts as the official minutes.

**AUDITOR YOST:** Mr. Chairman, I move that we dispense with the reading and adopt the transcripts as the official minutes of the previous meeting and the regional hearings.

**SECRETARY HUSTED OR PRESIDENT NIEHAUS:** Second.

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** The motion has been moved and seconded. Any objections? Seeing none, the minutes are adopted.

The Board at its last meeting adopted rules for the submission of proposed apportionment plans for the taking of public comments and testimony regarding the plans so submitted. The purpose of this meeting is to allow the presentation of timely submitted plans and public testimony on those plans.

Any person wishing to present a plan or offer testimony regarding a plan should fill out a witness form available on the table and give it to our staff.

Those who helped draft and create submitted plans know what a tough job this is, and I would like to thank each of you for taking the time and effort to draft a plan for our consideration.

To summarize our rules, any person or organization that has submitted a proposed plan of apportionment will be allowed to have its sponsor personally, or through a representative, present the substance of their plan to the board, for a period not to exceed 10 minutes unless extended by a majority of the board. In order to conduct this meeting in an orderly fashion under our rules, I will call each plan's sponsor or designated representative to present their plan. At the end of each sponsor's presentation, we will have time for questions by Board members as recognized by the chair.

Once a plan has been presented, the public may offer testimony in the order designated by the Chairman for a period not to exceed five minutes, unless extended by a majority of the board. The Chairman may limit testimony as he deems necessary.

I would ask witnesses to limit their testimony to the apportionment of state legislative districts, which is the sole charge of the Apportionment Board.

At this time I would ask the Secretaries to report to the Board the number of plans that were received and whether they were submitted in accordance with the rules.

**SECRETARY:** Mr. Chairman, four plans were submitted to the Board by the Friday, Sept. 23<sup>rd</sup> deadline. The rules adopted by the board required submissions to include hard copy and electronic versions of the legal definitions and visual representations of the proposed boundaries. One plan was submitted by the Joint Secretaries of the Apportionment Board with all board-required components. Two plans were submitted from the Ohio Campaign for Accountable Redistricting and included all components except a legal definition. The fourth plan was submitted by the Senate and House Democrat caucuses and included all required components except a legal definition.

**SECRETARY HUSTED:** Mr. Chairman, in the interest of considering all citizen input, I would like to move at this time that the Board accept these plans as submitted and receive testimony on them today.

**AUDITOR YOST:** Second.

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** The motion has been moved and seconded. Are there any objections? Seeing none, we will now proceed with testimony.

## II. Public Testimony

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** At this time I would like to call our first witness, the sponsor or representative of the plan submitted by \_\_\_\_\_. Please state and spell your name for the record.

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** Any questions for the witness?

*[Direct questions from the Board]*

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** Thank you for your testimony.

If any Member of the Board intends on offering an amendment to any plan, they may submit them in advance to the Secretaries at the [redistricting@redistricting.ohio.gov](mailto:redistricting@redistricting.ohio.gov) email address, and they will be timely conveyed to members of the Board.

I would ask the Secretaries to provide the Board with an update on some technical amendments to their submission.

**SECRETARY:** Mr. Chairman, we are preparing a technical amendment to our original submission that makes non-substantive corrections to the legal definitions such as the spelling of political subdivisions and references to various precincts, none of which makes any changes to the overall boundaries of the map itself. We will endeavor to email this to members of the Board as soon as possible.

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** Thank you. I will now entertain a motion to **RECESS** this meeting until Wednesday, September 28 at 10AM.

**AUDITOR YOST:** Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board stand in **RECESS** until Wednesday, September 28 at 10AM in the Senate Finance Hearing Room.

**SECRETARY HUSTED OR PRESIDENT NIEHAUS:** Second.

**GOVERNOR KASICH:** Will the Secretary please call the roll?


Hi Heather,

I hate to bother you with this question but I really am not sure who else to ask. In the proposed reapportionment map my subdivision of Columbus, Forest Park, was put into the 22<sup>nd</sup> HD which is the new John Carney district. We used to be part of Duffy's 21<sup>st</sup> HD but were removed to make that district a stronger Republican district. That makes a lot of sense and I heard rumors a couple weeks ago that we might be put into Carney's district which is okay as I had hoped to run against him next year. It will be a tough race but could be winnable.

The problem is that my Ward, **Columbus 54** was placed into the much more heavily democratic HD 25 instead of the Carney district. Four of the wards that are adjacent to mine were placed in the 22<sup>nd</sup> HD (Columbus Wards 30, 52, 53 and 61) the remaining four were divided between HD 19 (Columbus Ward 66, Ward 81 precincts B, C & Minerva Park Village) and HD 25 (Ward 81 precincts A, D, E & noncontiguous parts of Blendon Township that are surrounded by Ward 81). The connection of my ward to the 25<sup>th</sup> HD appears to be Columbus Ward 81E & one of the noncontiguous Blendon Twp. Areas, both of which are adjacent to Columbus 54F).

I wanted to see if there was any way my ward could be moved to the 22<sup>nd</sup> HD so I can run against Carney next year. If you cannot move the entire ward maybe you can emulate how Columbus Ward 81 was divided up between two House Districts and move just my precinct which is **Columbus 54 B**, which abuts Columbus Ward 81B to the north. That way you do not disrupt the parts of Sharon Township A was assigned to the 25<sup>th</sup> HD. That would probably be the simplest solution to my situation.

As it stands now the 25<sup>th</sup> HD has 119,779 people in its boundaries, the 22<sup>nd</sup> HD has 118,513 people for a difference of 1,266. As both HD are above the 116k threshold requirements, moving Columbus 54B would appear to be a simple move.




Again I hate to ask but I would prefer not to wait another ten years until the next reapportionment and risk a non-friendly apportionment board. Carney will be a tough opponent but I am ready to take him on. I have spent the past three and half years since I left the Ohio House getting ready for a challenge such as this. For the past two years I have served as the Executive Director of an inner-city nonprofit that provides educational programs to low income minority adults, for the past five years I have served on the board of two urban charter schools (including one in Forest Park Ward 52D which is in 22<sup>nd</sup> HD and accounts for 200 families and potential volunteers), I am a member of the largest church in the area with over 7,000 members, am past President of the Northland Kiwanis Club, I have run my own business since 2001, served as a past trustee of the Northland Area Business Association and for the past three years have been an adjunct faculty member of the University of Phoenix's Columbus Campus. As a Libertarian Republican I think that I am well positioned to make this a credible race against Carney. As you can see my only stumbling block is being drawn into the right district.

Thank you for your consideration of my request. Please let me know if there is anyone else I should talk to about my situation. I would be happy to talk to either Batchelder or Huffman if you think that would help.





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

Save, backup, review, consistency check


STOP! Take a break, sleep on it, if possible

Ask for legal review?







# Northern New Jersey Black % Legislative Districts

## Bartlett v. Strickland

This case turns on whether the first *Gingles* requirement can be satisfied when the minority group makes up less than 50 percent of the voting-age population in the potential election district

Unlike any of the standards proposed to allow crossover district claims, the majority-minority rule relies on an objective, numerical test: Do minorities make up more than 50 percent of the voting-age population in the relevant geographic area?




# Larios v. Cox


...Georgia's legislative plan violates the one person, one vote principle

The population deviations in the Georgia House and Senate Plans are not the result of an effort to further any legitimate, consistently applied state policy.

Rather, we have found that the deviations were systematically and intentionally created

- (1) To allow rural Georgia and inner-city Atlanta to maintain their legislative influence even as their rate of population growth lags behind that of the rest of the state; and
- (2) to protect Democrat incumbents




# New Jersey Population bottlenecks NJ waist





# Data

- Census PL-94-171 data
- Use presidential and statewide election data
- Legislative / congressional elections
- Limited local elections as needed
- Racial bloc data – Democrat primaries? Non-partisan?
- Use averages with caution
- ACS will be available, but it is not “snapshot” data
- Voter file data? Micro-targeting data?

DO NOT STOP

DO NOT STOP

In general, start from an endpoint and work toward a "checkpoint"

Allows for interchangeable options

Allows for simultaneous drawing

Track your cumulative deviation as you draw

Know the features and consequences of a plan option, whether you state them or not

Don't commit to a specific district until you test out the impact

## Never travel without counsel

These aren't the droids you're looking for.

Aspects of your redistricting will likely end up in court

Get advice, draw a plan, critique, revise, repeat

Be aware of the record that is building around your actions

Parliamentary strategy should support and complement

the legal strategy



What happened last time? Review the process.

Criteria used? How well followed? Who were the players?

Shifting seats – where? Incumbent pairings – how many?

How was it finally resolved? In the chamber? In the courts?

What has happened in the elections? the courts?

Make sure you can live with your criteria **BEFORE** you state them publicly

Keep it secret  
keep it safe

- Controlled access to location (a door with a key)
- Machine security, plan security, personnel security
- Storage and backup
- Away from distractions
- Establish procedures for input, drawing, output
- Process always matters
