


CIVIL COMPLAINT WRITTEN AND SUBMITTED BY

ROYAL PUBLIC OFFICIAL, MS. YVETTE BARBARA BALDWIN

The relator Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin asserts that this complaint is based on the fact that the relator as a citizen of the United States of America, has guaranteed unalienable rights, among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. The absolute rights of individuals may be resolved into the rights of liberty, and the right to acquire and enjoy property. These rights are declared to be natural, inherent, and unalienable. The relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin further asserts that she was employed as a sworn in Public Official with the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Common Pleas Criminal/Civil Division. The relator was hired in March of 2002, and began full time employment in April of 2002. The relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin, further advises that during the first few months of employment with the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Common Pleas Criminal/Civil Divisions; she was advised during working hours that as an employee she was requested to attend a viewing/showing of the Royal Jordanian Treasury Display; located on the 4th or 5th floors of the Hamilton County Courthouse. The Hamilton County Courthouse is located at 1000 Main Street, in Cincinnati, Ohio 45202. The relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin asserts that Hamilton County, Hamilton County Clerk of Courts, Hamilton County Common Pleas Criminal/Civil Division and the Facilitators of the Hamilton County Courthouse, were all operating clothed with governmental authority

during the relators employment with the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Common Pleas Criminal/Civil Division. The relator further asserts that when she viewed the Jordanian Royal Treasury Display at the Hamilton County Courthouse; located at 1000 Main Street, in Cincinnati, Ohio 45202; she visually read her name attached to the various Royal ancient items and artifacts in the Jordanian Royal Treasury room. The Relator further asserts that she read the Royal Jordanian Land Creed located near the middle of the room in a glass-like case. The Royal Jordanian Land Creed declares that the land of Jordan was giving to the relator Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin as an

Inheritance; including oil wells and a gold treasury; the Royal Jordanian land Creed declares that the land and the oil wells and the gold treasury and the treasury as listed in the Royal Jordanian land Creed, the Royal wealth and land could not be taken from the relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin. The relator further advises that her rights under the Color of Law have been violated, due to the fact that the relator has made several attempts to gain access to her Royal Jordanian Treasury Display; the relator has been denied access. The public officials with Hamilton County, The Hamilton County Clerk of Courts, The Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Common Pleas Criminal/Civil Divisions, and the facilitator of the Hamilton County Courthouse were all acting under the Color of Law when the relator made several attempts to gain access to her Royal Jordanian Treasury Display. The relator asserts that the Color of Law refers to an appearance of legal power to act but which may operate in violation of law. In addition the relator asserts that the Color of Law may include public officials, who are not law enforcement officers, for example Judges and Prosecutors. The relator further asserts that the Color of Law civil rights violations, is a crime for one or more persons acting under

Color of Law, willfully to deprive or conspire to deprive another person of any right protected by the Constitution or laws of the United States; depriving a person of his or her federal civil rights under Color of Law is, in and of itself, a federal crime and a ground for a cause of action; also called under color of law; if the conduct violates a federal civil right or criminal law, it is also called state action. The relator advises that she made contact with various Hamilton County Public officials; relator sent emails: electronic transmissions, relator sent letters through U.S. ordinary mail, relator made several phone calls and the relator met with a few of the officials in reference to gaining access to her Royal Jordanian Treasury Display. The relator acknowledges that she was assisted by some of the Public Officials at the time of contact to the best of their ability in that they did not know where the Jordanian Royal Treasury Display was setup at nor had they viewed the Jordanian Royal Treasury Display. The relator asserts that she left several messages and request that have not been responded to. The relator request that the court take into consideration the historical significance, worth, and merit of the Royal Jordanian Treasury Display and give immediate relief to the relator through immediate access to the relator's Royal Order/Edict book located in the Royal Treasury in the Hamilton County Courthouse. The relator further requests a guaranteed financial loan for approximately \$100,000.00 (one hundred thousand dollars) up to \$550,000.00 (five hundred fifty thousand dollars) within 48 hours of the filing of this complaint; completing the initial filing of the original action. The relator requests that the court use any assets listed nationally and internationally as collateral for the loan. The relator is requesting for a fair, equitable and speedy remedy granting damages to the relator.

AFFIDAVIT WRITTEN/SUBMITTED BY ROYAL PUBLIC OFFICIAL, MS. YVETTE

To begin this affidavit, it is necessary to give an explanation of my employment prior to becoming an employee of the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Common Pleas Criminal Division. My previous employment was with the Provident Bank of Cincinnati, Ohio; located at One East 4th Street; zip code 45202. I was employed as a Client Specialist in the Telebank department. During the start of my second year with Provident Bank I decided to research government employment opportunities with Hamilton County. I applied for a few positions until I interviewed and accepted the position as Deputy Research legal clerk. The hiring process included a national/international background check, financial check, interviews, fingerprinting and lab testing. I was officially hired for the position in March of 2002. During the first few months of my employment the employees in the civil and criminal divisions were invited by request to view the Jordanian Royal Treasury/Display setup Located in the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Building. The Hamilton County Clerk of Courts building is located at 1000 Main Street in downtown Cincinnati, Ohio 45202. The Jordanian Royal Treasury/Display is located on the 4th or 5th floor of the building. As an employee I was able to view the Royal land deed/contract, The Royal Order/Edict Book, and various precious ancient artifacts and items throughout the display room. The entire Royal Treasury/Display has the name Yvette Baldwin and or Yvette B. Baldwin and or Yvette K. attached with tags and or written on tags, designating ownership. The relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin; advises that she was not aware that the Royal Setup/Treasury/Display would be on view in the Hamilton County

Court House, Located at 1000 Main Street in Cincinnati, Ohio 45202. The relator was able to read through the land contract/creed located in a glass type case in the middle of the floor in the display room. The Jordanian Royal land creed asserts through written official, and formal declaration that the Jordanian land and various listings are owned by the relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin as a right or divine portion through inherited sovereignty. The relator further asserts that she has made contact with the Hamilton County Administrative Officials and the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts Administration in order to take, hold, and receive access to the Royal Treasury/Display. The relator has made contact through U.S. ordinary mail, electronic email messages, telephone calls and personal presentation request through walk-in meetings and preset appointments with various officials. The employees did not have the information available on the Royal Setup/Treasury/Display. The land contract declares that the relator has come into possession of the land of Jordan, oil wells and a gold treasury. The relator is concerned that with this amount of mass affluent wealth in a treasury her legal rights of ownership have been denied without legal justification. The relator request that the Supreme Court of Ohio subpoena the relator's financial records requested by the Hamilton County Clerk of Courts for employment in 2002. The financial records list the Royal Treasury/Display setup and personal and Royal wealth accounts with M&I Bank (Marshall & Ilsley Financial Corporation) of Indianapolis. The relator has suffered financially, and in status rank of society affecting the relator's standing or estimation in the overall perception of citizens. The relator, Royal Public Official, Ms. Yvette Barbara Baldwin petitions the court for immediate access to the Royal Treasury/Display setup. The immediate access would give the relator the Royal Order/Edict book in order to issue a Royal Order/Edict that

unites, joins the relators Royal Administrators as rightful Royals to legally inherit the Jordanian Land and Jordanian Royal Treasury/Display setup as a right or divine portion through inherited sovereignty. The Royal Administrators are also known as Royal Israeli Special Forces, Chief Abrams and his wife; and General Isaacs and his wife; and their descendants as they wish to include them in the land creed. The relator is requesting immediate assistance through the Supreme Court of Ohio to expedite this request.





On 5/10/2012 after careful consideration of the evidence, the Ohio Elections Commission adopted the following finding(s) in the above referenced matter:

THE COMMISSION FOUND A VIOLATION OF R.C. §3517.13(D) AND IMPOSED A FINE OF \$10,000 PLUS \$100 PER DAY COMMENCING ON MAY 10, 2012 AND CONTINUING UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE REPORT IS FILED. THE COMMISSION MAY RECONSIDER THE MATTER IF THE REPORT IS FILED WITH THE APPROPRIATE FILING OFFICE AND A PROPERLY NOTARIZED AFFIDAVIT IS RECEIVED BY THE COMMISSION WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE NOTIFICATION OF THE DISPOSITION.

If the decision in this case involves the imposition of a specific fine amount, payment of the fine must be made no later than 30 days after the date of this letter. Payment should be made payable and sent to the Ohio Elections Commission Fund at the above address. Unpaid fines will be sent to the Ohio Attorney General for collection.

If the disposition of this case involves a daily fine amount, you must contact the office in which you file your campaign finance reports and file the report. In addition, to have the daily fine reconsidered, you must file a notarized statement with the Commission. The filings and affidavit must be received within 30 days after the date of this letter. All properly notarized affidavits must include a statement above the notary public's signature that the document was "sworn to and signed" in the presence of the notary public and the date on which it was done.

If the decision in this case does not involve the imposition of a fine, there is no further action required of you by the Commission.

If the decision in this case is adverse to you, this case may be appealed pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §119.12. A Notice of Appeal must be filed within 15 days after the mailing of this Order. The Notice must be filed with the Commission and also at the Clerk's office for the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas.

In all cases, please use the OEC case no. listed at the top of this letter when corresponding with the Commission. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Commission staff at (614) 466-3205.
