In accordance with the May 2, 2012, Order of the Supreme Court of Ohio, Russell R. Miller, of Toledo, Ohio, Registration Number 0000674, is hereby appointed as the attorney who will monitor respondent Harvey C. Miller's compliance with the terms of his probation. Russell Miller and Harvey Miller are not related.

The term of probation is one year from the date respondent Harry C. Miller is reinstated to the practice of law following his six month suspension pursuant to the Court's May 2, 2012, Order, unless altered by the Court. At the end of that term, respondent may apply for termination of the probation.

The monitoring attorney shall:

1. Monitor compliance by respondent with the conditions of probation imposed by the Supreme Court.
 2. Observe respondent's professional conduct.
 3. Meet with respondent, personally or by telephone, at the monitoring attorney's option, at least once per month.
 4. Satisfy himself that respondent is appropriately handling legal matters entrusted to him
 5. Provide guidance and mentoring as appropriate.
 6. Immediately report to the Bar Council any violations by respondent of either the terms of probation or the Rules of Professional Conduct.
- Report to the Bar Council at least once per quarter, in writing, with the first report due on or before February 2, 2013.

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The monitoring attorney shall verify respondent's compliance with the terms of probation in such reasonable manner as he may determine. The monitoring attorney may require more frequent meetings than monthly at his discretion.

Respondent shall:

1. Comply with all of the terms of probation ordered by the Supreme Court of Ohio, as set forth in the Court's order of May 2, 2012, or otherwise.
2. Provide such evidence as the monitoring attorney requires to verify respondent's compliance with the terms of probation.
3. Provide such written releases or waivers as the monitoring attorney requires to verify respondent's compliance with the terms of probation.
4. Keep the TBA and the monitoring attorney informed of his current mailing address and phone number.
5. Meet personally or telephonically with the monitoring attorney as stated above.
6. Cooperate fully with the efforts of the monitoring attorney.
