

CLAIM DETERMINATION ENTRY

In Re Application of Avio Allen v. SaKeya MonCheree Stubbs
Claim Number 11-0101

This cause came on for hearing before the Board of Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund this **7th day of September 2012** on the application of Avio Allen alleging a loss in the amount of \$350, caused by dishonest conduct of an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Ohio

The Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund of Ohio find that:

- a) An attorney client relationship did exist between the claimant and SaKeya MonCheree Stubbs.
- b) The claimant suffered a loss of \$350 on or about August, 2010.

The Commissioners further find that the dishonest conduct consisted of theft of unearned fees, and that the following disciplinary proceedings were taken:

Suspended Indefinitely on 2/15/2011

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.

Therefore the Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund do hereby determine that the claim of Avio Allen is eligible for reimbursement in the amount of \$350.

Payment of said amount is conditioned upon claimant complying with the subrogation assignment and other requirements of Sec. 6 of GOV. Rule VIII of the Ohio Supreme Court.



CLAIM DETERMINATION ENTRY

In Re Application of Robert L. Beck v. SaKeya MonCheree Stubbs
Claim Number 11-0074

This cause came on for hearing before the Board of Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund this 7th day of September 2012 on the application of Robert L. Beck alleging a loss in the amount of \$13,150, caused by dishonest conduct of an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Ohio

The Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund of Ohio find that:

- a) An attorney client relationship did exist between the claimant and SaKeya MonCheree Stubbs.
- b) The claimant suffered a loss of \$12,750 on or about February 5, 2011.

The Commissioners further find that the dishonest conduct consisted of settlement theft, and that the following disciplinary proceedings were taken:

Suspended Indefinitely on 2/15/2011

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.

Therefore the Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund do hereby determine that the claim of Robert L. Beck is eligible for reimbursement in the amount of \$12,750.

Payment of said amount is conditioned upon claimant complying with the subrogation assignment and other requirements of Sec. 6 of GOV. Rule VII of the Ohio Supreme Court.


