






ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

In accordance with Rule V(11)(F)(1) of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar of Ohio, the Disciplinary Counsel of the Supreme Court of Ohio filed with the clerk of this court a certified copy of the January 24, 2000 order of the Supreme Court of New York imposing a seven-year indefinite suspension upon respondent.

On consideration thereof, it is ordered by the Supreme Court of Ohio that respondent, Thomas Charles Nicotera, Attorney Registration Number 0018903, notify this court, within twenty (20) days of the service of this order to show cause, of any claim predicated upon the grounds set forth in Gov.Bar R. V(11)(F)(4)(a), that the imposition of identical or comparable discipline in this State would be unwarranted and the reasons for that claim.

It is further ordered, sua sponte, that all documents filed with this court in this case shall meet the filing requirements set forth in the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court of Ohio, including requirements as to form, number, and timeliness of filings. All case documents are subject to Rules 44 through 47 of the Rules of Superintendence of Ohio which govern access to court records.

It is further ordered, sua sponte, that service on respondent shall be deemed made by sending this order, and all other orders in this case, to respondent's last known address.
