



CROSS-EXAMINATION

9

BY MR. MATHEWS:

10

Q. To start things off, if you would, please state
11 your name and your business address.

11

12

A. It's Ronald Joseph Myers. My business address is
13 114 Court Street, Cadiz, Ohio 43907.

13

Q. What is your current occupation?

15

A. Sheriff of the county.

16

Q. Sheriff Myers, how long have you served here as
17 the sheriff?

17

18

A. I'm in my fifth year.

19

Q. And before that, were you with the sheriff's
20 department?

20

21

A. No, I was with the sheriff's office for -- since
22 '97. Prior to that, I was here part-time since
23 '81.

Q. You may be aware that I, along with another
25 attorney, Greg Beck, represent Timothy Swanson,

25

1 who I believe you're familiar with?

2 A. Uh-huh.

3 Q. You're familiar with Mr. Swanson, correct?

4 A. Uh-huh.

5 Q. We're involved in a lawsuit with respect to an
6 appointment of George Maier to serve as
7 Stark County Sheriff. I believe you're familiar
8 with that appointment as well?

9 A. That's correct.

10 Q. I'll be here asking you a few questions about a
11 period of time during which, I understand, that
12 George Maier was employed as a deputy sheriff
13 here. That's primarily going to be the area of my
14 questioning.

15 During the course of my questions, if you
16 don't hear any of my questions or they're not
17 phrased well for you, I'd appreciate it if you let
18 me know that as we move along, okay?

19 A. Okay.

20 Q. First, let's talk a little bit about your
21 department.

22 A. Office.

23 Q. Your office.

24 A. It's a sheriff's office.

25 Q. Okay. Thank you.

1 A. I'm elected, not appointed.

2 Q. Your office consists of -- well, what's the
3 structure of your office below you as the sheriff?

4 A. We have a total of 12 individuals below me. I
5 have four radio dispatchers, three corrections
6 officers, and the rest are deputies underneath me
7 ranging from lieutenants to deputies.

8 Q. Do you have various classes of deputies?

9 A. I just have deputies and lieutenants and
10 sergeants.

11 Q. Are any of those positions either full-time or
12 part-time?

13 A. All of them are -- the only part-time position
14 that's actually classified part-time is one of the
15 dispatch areas. He fills in four days a week.

16 Q. Otherwise then --

17 A. Four shifts.

18 Q. Otherwise then, if I understand the structure of
19 your office, all of the other positions are
20 considered full-time?

21 A. Correct.

22 Q. Is there any type of organizational chart or any
23 written --

24 A. No.

25 Q. -- policy --

1 A. No.

2 Q. Nothing in writing that defines the structure?

3 A. No.

4 Q. Is there any particular policy manual, directive,
5 any other written document that identifies what
6 full-time service in the office means?

7 A. That's between the auditor -- the county and the
8 auditor. The auditor classifies what a full-time
9 person is.

10 Q. Do you know if the auditor for the county has
11 issued any type of policy manual or directive that
12 indicates what a full-time employee is?

13 A. The only thing that I know that he does do is he
14 requires full-time employees to fill out all the
15 necessary paperwork. They get all the benefits
16 when they are full-time. If they need -- if they
17 are in the union -- because I do have two unions
18 here. One -- well, actually three separate ones,
19 deputies, sergeants, and dispatchers. He'll give
20 all that paperwork to them for filling out for the
21 county payroll.

22 Q. The current makeup, you indicated for me, is
23 12 individuals underneath you, correct?

24 A. I believe.

25 Q. Is there any writing that sets that number as the

1 number of positions available in the office?

2 A. No.

3 Q. Tell me how that number may fluctuate from time to
4 time. Is it based upon the need or are there
5 other criteria involved?

6 A. Budget is the big thing. We went through a budget
7 crunch the last four years -- previous four years
8 prior to me coming into office as sheriff. We
9 went through that. I went out and got several
10 grants to keep the office alive, so to speak.
11 This year, the commissioners were able to give me
12 back what I had lost in '09 so I could hire a few
13 additional people.

14 Q. Has the number 12, though, basically remained
15 constant for a period of time? Tell me just a
16 little bit, say, over the past two years how that
17 may have fluctuated.

18 A. In the past two years, it hasn't fluctuated. I
19 wasn't able, really, to do anything until last
20 August. We seen that the revenues was up due to
21 the gas and oil influx in the county. We were
22 able to put some additional people on. We were
23 able to hire one last August, and we hired one --
24 we were going to hire George in the beginning of
25 the year.

- 1 Q. Again, I'm not trying to move this along too
2 quickly, but, say, in the past two years, you've
3 hired only the one additional deputy back in the
4 fall of last year?
- 5 A. August of last year.
- 6 Q. August of last year?
- 7 A. Yes.
- 8 Q. Did that bring the level to 12 personnel under you
9 or did that make it --
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. That brought it to 12?
- 12 A. Yeah.
- 13 Q. At that time, was there consideration that there
14 was a vacancy or --
- 15 A. Yes. With all the gas and oil and the extra
16 revenue that the county started receiving, in my
17 meetings with the commissioners, we seen the need
18 to hire an additional person. That's when I
19 looked at George for that additional person.
- 20 Q. How do you go about, in your office, creating an
21 additional position of deputy? Is there anything
22 formal, any structure to that?
- 23 A. No, it's just the need since -- with the gas and
24 oil influx in the county, the need was there.
25 George and I had talked in person, and he was the

1 right guy for the job.

2 Q. Well, I assume the same process went forward back
3 in August of 2012. You formulated the position
4 that there was a need for another deputy at that
5 time?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. And you hired someone, correct?

8 A. Yes, yes.

9 Q. Who's the person you hired in August?

10 A. Morgan Knight.

11 Q. And is it Mr. Knight? Deputy Knight?

12 A. Deputy Knight.

13 Q. Deputy Knight's hired on as a full-time deputy?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Is he still with the office?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. What is his work schedule generally? Is it a
18 fixed schedule?

19 A. He has a fixed schedule now. When we first hire
20 somebody, we kind of move them all around to stay
21 within the 80 hours. We didn't know exactly where
22 the total need was going to be. Once we got it
23 set in -- because I'm trying to -- I've been
24 working hard with the drug problem in the county,
25 as every county has. So with that, why, we were

1 able to set a schedule for him based on the need
2 at the time we're at.

3 Q. When you say you work within the 80 hours, what
4 does that mean?

5 A. Well, by contract, they have to work 80 hours in a
6 14-day period.

7 Q. Is that a union contract you're talking about?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. That requires you, in terms of scheduling your
10 deputies, to give them at least 80 hours in a
11 14-day period?

12 A. Correct.

13 Q. Does that union agreement specify that that
14 satisfies a full-time status?

15 A. Correct, it does.

16 Q. Who is that union contract with?

17 A. FOP.

18 Q. So it would be between your office and the FOP?

19 A. Correct, and the county commissioners. We all
20 sign off on it.

21 Q. If we look back -- and I'm not trying to take you
22 too far back. But let's just say a
23 year-and-a-half or two years before the hiring of
24 Deputy Knight, when was the last hiring of a
25 deputy?

1 A. Well, we went through a layoff in, I'm going to
2 say -- well, we actually didn't go through a
3 layoff. When the COPS grants ran out, the county
4 seen that there was no more funding available. We
5 talked with the feds, because that's one of the
6 criteria on the feds side, that we have to -- we
7 don't have to, but we should retain that person
8 after the three-year period, after it's gradually
9 gone.

10 We had three individuals on that, and we
11 lost them through the COPS grants. The two that
12 we were able to retain was our school resource
13 officers. The school was able to pick those up.
14 It's like an 80/20 deal. We pick up 20 percent
15 and they pick up 80 percent.

16 Q. So it sounds like if we just look at that isolated
17 period of a year or two before Deputy Knight was
18 hired, there really wasn't any hiring of deputies?

19 A. No.

20 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection.

21 Go ahead.

22 Q. There was not the hiring of any deputies in the
23 two-year period prior to the hiring of
24 Deputy Knight?

25 A. Correct.

1 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading
2 question. Go ahead.

3 Q. Tell me the name of any individual that was hired
4 as a deputy in the two-year period prior to the
5 hiring of Deputy Knight.

6 A. There wasn't any.

7 Q. Was there a vacancy in the office in January of
8 2013?

9 A. No. There was not a vacancy, no.

10 Q. By a vacancy, I just mean there had not been any
11 position left vacant by someone retiring or
12 leaving. Anything to that effect?

13 A. No, there wasn't.

14 Q. But if I understand your testimony correctly, you
15 once again, in your position as sheriff, went
16 through the evaluation that there was the need for
17 hiring another deputy?

18 A. That is correct.

19 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading. Go
20 ahead.

21 Q. In January of 2013, did you determine the need for
22 hiring someone?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. What went into that process of determining the
25 need for hiring someone in the office?

1 A. Well, the county's been very busy with the gas and
2 oil, as I stated. There's a lot of traffic on the
3 road, and we needed -- with my negotiations with
4 the commissioners to see where my budget was going
5 to be, we felt that there was going to be a need
6 for additional manpower out on the roads for this
7 gas and oil.

8 So that's when, here at the office, we
9 made the determination that we needed to start
10 looking to hiring. Actually, back at the end of
11 December is when we actually started looking at
12 that.

13 Q. How did you go about the process of starting to
14 fill the additional position?

15 A. Well, you know, we take all the applications that
16 are in at the time and we give them a general
17 idea, because we're not sure -- you know, as being
18 sheriff -- and you've got to understand county
19 government. I guess the trust is never there that
20 you're actually going to get the budget you're
21 going to get until you get done on January 2nd.

22 So when they were able to give me the
23 budget, that's when we started looking at the
24 first part of January for the additional people.

25 Q. Did you have applications on file that you turned

1 to?

2 A. No.

3 Q. Did you advertise in any fashion for the position?

4 A. No.

5 Q. If you would, please, Sheriff Myers, tell me how
6 contact was made with George Maier about applying
7 for the position.

8 A. Him and I talked in January. On January I believe
9 it was 5th, we had supper together down in
10 New Philly. We talked. I was telling him I was
11 getting ready to look at somebody to hire, and he
12 said, "Well, I'd like to have the position if I
13 could get it." I said, "Okay."

14 With his background and his experience in
15 law enforcement and what I was needing -- because
16 we talked about what was going on. He knew pretty
17 much what was going on in the county as far as the
18 gas and oil. He'd be a good fit here.

19 Q. Was that meeting that you had on January 5th
20 prearranged in some fashion, I take it?

21 A. We had talked about doing -- we were trying to get
22 together over the holidays. We had been good
23 friends forever, for a long time. He was post
24 commander here. I followed his tour of duty with
25 the patrol clear up through when he was captain

1 and was selected, eventually, for the assistant
2 director of public safety for the State of Ohio.

3 Q. So you had a relationship with him, a familiarity
4 with George Maier?

5 A. Right.

6 Q. This meeting that was arranged, was it arranged
7 more as a casual get-together of friends or was it
8 to discuss business relating to the office?

9 A. No, it was just a casual meeting as friends. We
10 really didn't -- you know, then we started talking
11 about work. He started talking about work at
12 Massillon. I started talking about work here.

13 Q. I take it then what you're describing is the
14 conversation turned to potentially filling the
15 position that you wanted to create by having
16 George apply?

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. Mr. Maier eventually submits an application for
19 the position of deputy sheriff with you, correct?

20 A. That's correct.

21 Q. And do you know what date that was? We'll be
22 looking at some documents, but do you recall what
23 date it was?

24 A. Yeah, it was the 7th.

25 Q. So about two days after this meeting that you had?

1 A. Correct.

2 Q. What specific position was he going to apply for?

3 A. Well, he would start as an entry level deputy, and
4 that's what he applied for.

5 Q. Does that designation of entry level deputy mean
6 anything in particular?

7 A. No, it's just where all the guys start at.

8 Q. Is that specified in the union contract what that
9 means?

10 A. No, I don't believe.

11 Q. Is that any different than the classification of
12 any other deputy under the union contract?

13 A. No.

14 Q. Would the same provision of the union contract,
15 relating to providing the 80 hours in 14 days,
16 apply to George's position?

17 A. That is correct.

18 Q. Prior to the application being submitted on
19 January 7th, 2013 by Mr. Maier, did you have any
20 conversations with anyone else from Stark County
21 relating to appointment of George Maier as a
22 deputy sheriff here?

23 A. No.

24 Q. In this process of discussing Mr. Maier's
25 application with your office, was there discussion

1 about what was anticipated in terms of the
2 arrangement?

3 A. Explain that.

4 Q. Well, was it anticipated that Mr. Maier would join
5 your office as a full-time deputy?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Meaning what?

8 A. That he would be required to put in full-time
9 hours once the schedule was started, and he would
10 do his 80 hours, roughly, in 14 days.

11 Q. So in other words, what was anticipated from the
12 outset is what's basically required under the
13 union contract?

14 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

15 Q. What you described as "anticipated," is that
16 consistent with what's required in the union
17 contract between your office and the FOP?

18 A. Yes, it is.

19 Q. When Mr. Maier started -- and by the way, let's
20 clarify that for the record. The application date
21 was January 7th of 2013. What's Mr. Maier's
22 official appointment date?

23 A. His official appointment date would have been --
24 let me look at my notes here. I think it would
25 have been -- actually, the -- hang on one second.

1 His official appointment date would have been
2 January 7th of 2017.

3 MR. ROSENBERG: You said 2017.

4 A. Oh. Excuse me. That's when it expires. Sorry.
5 January 6th. January 6th was his official
6 appointment date.

7 MR. ROSENBERG: You said 2017 is the
8 year. I think that's --

9 A. Yes, right. It ends on my term. See, the
10 appointment goes from the 6th of January of 2013
11 and it ends when my term ends. All appointments
12 end on my term ending, which would be January 7th
13 of 2017.

14 MR. ROSENBERG: Okay.

15 A. So that's four years from now, roughly.

16 Q. Had the appointment documentation simply been
17 filled out before the application? Is that the
18 reason it's dated the day before?

19 A. Yes. He came down on a Sunday. We did speak on
20 Sunday, and we filled out some of the paperwork on
21 Sunday.

22 Q. At that time, with his official appointment date
23 fixed, was there a schedule then assigned for
24 Mr. Maier?

25 A. I asked him when he was going to be able to start.

1 He told me that he was going to come down on a
2 Saturday and a Sunday. Then I told him to go
3 ahead and do that, and then we'll get the rest of
4 the schedule started shortly thereafter. He can
5 talk to me.

6 Q. Was there a schedule fixed for him before he came
7 here for his first day of work?

8 A. Yes. He was to report on that Saturday, which he
9 did.

10 Q. Which was the Saturday following the appointment,
11 correct?

12 A. Yes, correct.

13 Q. Who does the scheduling? Is that something that
14 you handle?

15 A. No, my lieutenant handles that.

16 Q. In this instance, did a lieutenant handle the
17 scheduling of Mr. Maier?

18 A. No, because we hadn't got to talk yet about what
19 his schedule was going to be. I told the
20 lieutenant that we were going to have him work
21 those two days.

22 Q. It's just a function of what was going on. You
23 handled it directly in terms of --

24 A. Correct.

25 Q. Is it correct that you had Mr. Maier report on the

1 following Saturday?

2 A. Correct.

3 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

4 Q. At the time of Mr. Maier's appointment as a deputy
5 sheriff with your office, was there any fixed
6 anticipated duration for his service?

7 A. Explain that.

8 Q. Was it going to be limited at all in time? I know
9 that you had mentioned, for instance, the
10 appointment itself technically runs through the
11 balance of your term, correct?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. But was there any arrangement that his term of
14 service with you would otherwise be set by days,
15 weeks, years?

16 A. Yes, he knew there would be a schedule.

17 Q. But was it going to be limited in duration, that
18 he was only planning to work with you for a period
19 of days, months? Anything specific like that?

20 A. No, there was nothing.

21 Q. Did your office provide Mr. Maier with any
22 equipment after his appointment as a deputy
23 sheriff?

24 A. No.

25 Q. Was he given any type of uniform?

1 A. No.

2 Q. Was he given a badge?

3 A. No.

4 Q. Was he given keys or some form of access card to
5 enter the building?

6 A. He was given his ID card. He wasn't given key
7 fobs yet. We have key fobs that actually swipe.

8 Q. Was he given any type of written materials, any
9 policy manuals, any employment manuals that your
10 office routinely uses?

11 A. No, I told him he could view that. We have that
12 actually set up on our computer.

13 Q. Was there any type of training session for
14 Mr. Maier before he started working with the
15 office?

16 A. No.

17 Q. It's my understanding that following Mr. Maier's
18 appointment as a deputy sheriff in your office,
19 you did notify the county auditor's office in some
20 fashion?

21 A. Yes.

22 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

23 Q. Following Mr. Maier's appointment by you to serve
24 as a deputy sheriff in your office, did you notify
25 the auditor's office?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. How?

3 A. I told him I hired a new person.

4 Q. How did you notify them? In writing? A phone
5 call? What mechanism?

6 A. I talked to the deputy auditor and advised him
7 that we had a new hire, to prepare the paperwork
8 for a full-time position.

9 Q. Who is the deputy auditor?

10 A. Mark Soos.

11 Q. How do you spell Mark's last name?

12 A. S-o-o-s.

13 Q. Following Mr. Maier's appointment to serve as a
14 deputy sheriff in your office, did you notify the
15 clerk of courts of the common pleas court?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. How?

18 A. I took over his appointment papers.

19 Q. Were the appointment papers then filed?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Do you know what day they were filed?

22 A. It's whatever's stamped on them. January 14th of
23 2013 at 12:27 in the afternoon.

24 Q. Is there anything else that's required, to your
25 knowledge, to complete an appointment of someone

1 as a deputy sheriff in your office?

2 A. Yes, we have to send in paperwork to OPOTA to
3 advise of that same appointment.

4 Q. Was that paperwork done in this instance?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Was there a separate personnel file created for
7 Mr. Maier?

8 A. What do you mean?

9 Q. A separate personnel file. Was a file created for
10 Mr. Maier?

11 A. Yeah, with all his papers in it.

12 Q. No different than any other appointment you would
13 make?

14 A. No.

15 Q. And the documentation that was requested by
16 Mr. Beck, I take it, included a copy of that file;
17 is that correct?

18 A. That's correct.

19 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

20 Q. When you had the conversation with Mr. Maier back
21 on January 5th of 2013, did you discuss the fact
22 that Mr. Maier was, at that time, a full-time
23 employee of the City of Massillon?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. You knew that?

1 A. Uh-huh.

2 Q. Did you know what position Mr. Maier held with the
3 City of Massillon at the time?

4 A. I believe it was safety director.

5 Q. Did you discuss with Mr. Maier whether or not he
6 would continue in that position with the City of
7 Massillon after appointment with you?

8 A. No.

9 Q. What was your understanding with respect to
10 whether or not Mr. Maier was going to continue his
11 full-time employment with the City of Massillon
12 after the appointment with your office?

13 A. Well, I don't know what his anticipation was, but
14 he knew that he had to work 14 days -- or 80 hours
15 in 14 days here. However he was going to do that,
16 that was up to him after the schedule was set.

17 Q. After the appointment of Mr. Maier on January 7th,
18 whatever the official date might have been, the
19 6th, of 2013, did Mr. Maier ever report and serve
20 80 hours in a 14-day period?

21 A. What?

22 Q. Did Mr. Maier ever report and serve 80 hours in a
23 14-day period?

24 A. No.

25 Q. It is my understanding that Mr. Maier did report

1 here for duty on two days; is that correct?

2 A. That is correct.

3 Q. And it was Saturday, the 12th of January, 2013,
4 and Sunday, the 13th, correct?

5 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

6 (Plaintiff's Exhibit 1, Personnel File, was
7 marked for identification purposes.)

8 Q. For the record, Sheriff Myers, I've handed you
9 what we've marked as Plaintiff's Exhibit 1.
10 You'll see that it's a document consisting of
11 numerous pages that are numbered at the bottom
12 from Page 1 through Page 33 for your reference.

13 A. I don't have that. He does. We'll trade.

14 Q. That's fine.

15 A. All right.

16 Q. What I'd like to do is just go through this and
17 have you identify what Exhibit 1 consists of.

18 A. Okay.

19 Q. First of all, do you recognize the document that's
20 in front of you?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Generally speaking, what do these documents
23 comprise?

24 A. What the top part of this is is our ID cards.

25 It's when we give a new officer or a new deputy an

1 ID card once he's hired here. Then the other
2 document is our basic application for employment.

3 Q. So on Page 1 of Exhibit 1, you've identified that
4 the middle section or lower section is the
5 application submitted by Mr. Maier?

6 A. That's correct.

7 Q. And then the top portion is a copy of the card
8 that was issued upon his appointment?

9 A. Correct.

10 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

11 Q. Page 2. Just identify what Page 2 is a photocopy
12 of.

13 A. It's a photocopy of Mr. Maier's driver's license
14 and also his Social Security card.

15 Q. Were those items that you asked for as part of the
16 application process?

17 A. That is part of the application process.

18 Q. Page 3 of Exhibit 1, please identify that.

19 A. That is a copy of Mike DeWine's letter on
20 July 28th, 2011 for Sheriff Timothy Swanson. The
21 reference is the evaluation for training for
22 Deputy George Maier. It shows that -- the letter
23 serves as no update training required at this
24 time.

25 Q. Is that a copy of a document that was contained in

1 your personnel file for Mr. Maier?

2 A. That is correct.

3 Q. Why was that paperwork in there?

4 A. Because Mr. Maier had been an officer or a deputy
5 in Stark County as well as in Ross County, and
6 that's required. He was showing me that he was
7 still valid at this point in time during his
8 transition back to the office of sheriff in
9 Stark County.

10 Q. Next page, Page 4 of Exhibit 1, can you identify
11 that?

12 A. I'm assuming -- and I hate to do that. This is
13 just a paper that comes from Canton Municipal
14 Court that must have been requested by
15 Stark County if there was anything criminal,
16 traffic, civil in reference to George Maier prior
17 to his appointment at Stark County.

18 Q. Is Page 4 of Exhibit 1 taken from the employment
19 file that you maintained for Mr. Maier?

20 A. Yes, that was provided to me by Mr. Maier.

21 Q. Next, Page 5. Can you identify what that is?

22 A. Page 5 is a BCI records check. We were required
23 to provide or get background checks completed.
24 There is an FBI and BCI on any new applicant.
25 That's what that is. There's no criminal history

1 on file at BCI.

2 Q. Was Page 5 taken from the employment file you
3 maintained for Mr. Maier?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. How did you receive Exhibit 5?

6 A. Electronically over our Webcheck here at the
7 Harrison County Sheriff's Office.

8 Q. Is it standard when you go through the appointment
9 process to have a BCI check done on an individual
10 applying for a position?

11 A. Yes, I just said that.

12 Q. And then the next page, 6?

13 A. This is the FBI that comes back as well through
14 BCI for the employment of a new law enforcement
15 officer. This also is a requirement that is done.
16 There was no record with the FBI.

17 Q. Exhibit 7?

18 A. These are actually the prints that were submitted
19 electronically. We brought this back from -- this
20 was requested back from BCI so we'd have a copy of
21 the prints on file.

22 Q. Exhibit 7 was also taken from a portion of your
23 file; is that correct?

24 A. That is correct.

25 Q. Exhibit 8, can you identify what that is? You

1 might want to look at 8, 9, and 10, perhaps even
2 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, as a group.

3 A. Exhibit 8 is the Ohio Peace Officer Training
4 Academy that was held, which every law enforcement
5 officer that goes through the OPOTA training
6 receives one of these. It shows that they
7 completed their training as an Ohio peace officer.
8 This was issued to Mr. Maier on June 16th, 1981.

9 Q. Just another document that was contained in your
10 file?

11 A. Contained in the file that shows that he's done
12 his training.

13 Q. Sheriff Myers, if you would, just proceed with the
14 next document.

15 A. The Trade and Industrial Education Services,
16 Vocational Division, this is also another document
17 that's recognized by OPOTA for basic law
18 enforcement training. That he has completed
19 adequately -- satisfactorily completed the 310
20 hours of instruction in basic law enforcement
21 training. This is also a document dated
22 June 10th, 1981, which is also in Mr. Maier's file
23 here at the Harrison County Sheriff's Office.

24 Q. Very well. Page 10 of Exhibit 1.

25 A. Lawrence Township Police Academy where he was --

1 I've got his first appointment. It's also just
2 saying that he's completed his 310 hours of
3 instruction on basic law enforcement in the period
4 of March 17th, '81 to June 10th of '81. This was
5 awarded to him on June 20th of '81 by the
6 commander of the school.

7 Q. Another page from your employment file?

8 A. Yes, another page from the employment file.

9 Q. Thank you. What's Page 11?

10 A. The next page is Ohio State Highway Patrol
11 Academy. This certifies that George T. Maier has
12 completed basic training prescribed by the
13 Ohio State Highway Patrol in the 112th Academy
14 Class as a trooper. That was dated March 25th of
15 1983 by Colonel Walsh, and that is also in our
16 file.

17 Q. The next page should be Page 12 from Exhibit 1.
18 Can you identify that?

19 A. This is Stark County Sheriff's Office Certificate
20 of Training, which the governor signed last year
21 about -- we had to have human trafficking
22 training. This was awarded to George Maier for
23 completing the two hours of human trafficking on
24 October 18th of 2012, which is required by the
25 State and which is part of our file.

1 Q. We're on to Page 13.

2 A. The State of Ohio -- this is -- the Ohio Auditor
3 of State certifies that George Maier has
4 successfully completed April 20th Certified Public
5 Records Training fulfilling the requirements under
6 Section 109.43(B) effective September 29th of
7 2007. That's part of our file as well here at the
8 office.

9 Q. Next would be Page 14 of Exhibit 1.

10 A. Ohio State Highway Patrol Stark County Police
11 Chiefs Association certifies that Stark County
12 Sheriff's Deputy, George Maier, has successfully
13 completed a three-hour Crucial Conversations
14 Training dated October 20th of 2011. This is
15 signed by Chief Andrew Turowski, I suppose,
16 President of the Stark County Chiefs, I probably
17 butchered that, and Lieutenant Toby Smith of the
18 Ohio State Highway Patrol. This is also in our
19 file.

20 Q. The next page, Page 15, can you identify that for
21 us?

22 A. This was also a certification that George Maier
23 has completed Attorney General Mike DeWine's --
24 no. Excuse me. This would have been -- this
25 would have been Richard Cordray's Awareness of

1 Human Trafficking on 11/19 of 2010. This is prior
2 to the governor's signature last year.

3 Q. These particular items, Sheriff Myers, marked
4 Pages 8 through 15 of Exhibit 1, how were they
5 given to you?

6 A. During the employment process, George had prepared
7 this for me to show that he did have all his
8 training requirements in place. That's what he
9 had presented to me upon his completion of all
10 these forms at the office.

11 Q. Were they basically just items given to you along
12 with the application?

13 A. Yes, to show me how much training he's had and the
14 training that's required by the State.

15 Q. We're about halfway through Exhibit 1. We're
16 looking at Page 16. Can you identify that for us?

17 A. Hate to assume, but I'm assuming this is a special
18 commission given by former Sheriff Swanson for
19 George as a deputy sheriff. It says it's special.
20 That he'll uphold and support the constitution of
21 the United States and faithfully discharge the
22 duties of a special deputy sheriff, which is the
23 same as deputy sheriff. There's no discretion in
24 that.

25 It was signed by George, and I don't know

1 who notarized it. I can't -- I don't know if
2 that's Vivian. I have no idea what that last name
3 is. That's part of his certification that he
4 received from -- oh, that's Linda. Okay. That's
5 the notary. All right. Whatever.

6 Q. Is Page 16 copied from your employment file that
7 you maintain for Mr. Maier?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Any particular reason that documentation was in
10 your file or is it, again, just something --

11 A. It's just something that he was showing me that he
12 was a deputy sheriff in Stark County under former
13 Sheriff Swanson.

14 Q. Next page, Page 17, is that something that was
15 copied from your file regarding Mr. Maier?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Any particular reason Page 17 was in your file?

18 A. It was copied. It was all the information that he
19 gave me from when he was appointed at the
20 Stark County Sheriff's Office. Apparently a
21 secretary up there felt that it was important that
22 she write this letter out. She signed it and
23 handed it to him.

24 Q. I notice this particular letter speaks to OPOTA's
25 receipt of a notice of termination. Do you see

1 that in the second paragraph?

2 A. Uh-huh.

3 Q. You mentioned earlier about the process of
4 notifying OPOTA of an appointment of a deputy
5 sheriff, correct?

6 A. Right.

7 Q. Are you familiar with the process of notifying
8 OPOTA of the termination of a deputy sheriff?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Tell me what your understanding is of that.

11 MR. HERVEY: Objection. Relevance.

12 Q. Tell me what your understanding is of that.

13 A. Well, the understanding is once an officer has
14 gave us a -- whether it's a resignation letter or
15 he has been terminated from employment from an
16 office of sheriff, we have to file paperwork with
17 OPOTA showing that termination or resignation,
18 whichever the case may be.

19 Q. Do you have an understanding of whether or not a
20 peace officer can maintain two appointments
21 registered with OPOTA --

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. -- at a time?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. What is your understanding of that?

1 A. The understanding is that they can. As long as
2 they're deputy sheriffs, they can have two
3 appointments.

4 Q. What about as to any other peace officer
5 appointments?

6 MR. ROSENBERG: I'm just going to object.
7 Calls for legal conclusions.

8 Go ahead, Sheriff.

9 A. There is an opinion from the attorney general that
10 police officers and sheriffs cannot be co-mingled.

11 Q. Next page, Page 18 of Exhibit 1, can you identify
12 that for us?

13 A. Yeah, that's my certification of employment -- of
14 appointment. That also is here in -- a copy is in
15 his file as well as a copy to the appointee. In
16 this case, it was George T. Maier. One of these
17 is also sent over to the clerk of courts with his
18 other appointing papers. So it's in his file.

19 Q. Is it documentation that's just part of the
20 employment process?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Pretty standard in terms of how you appoint deputy
23 sheriffs, I take it?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. Page 19, identify that for us, please.

1 A. That's our payroll record.

2 Q. Is that form, without what's filled in, is that
3 form what you use on a standard basis for
4 documenting the hours served?

5 A. Yes. We changed this form. We came out of a
6 lawsuit last year, and that was one of the things
7 that the lawsuit -- we allow people to write their
8 own times in. We did it a little bit different.
9 This is basically their timecard. They have to
10 fill it out. They have to sign it.

11 Q. I take it this is, and tell me if I'm wrong, but a
12 photocopy of the timecard for George Maier?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. It indicates his name at the top, correct?

15 A. Correct.

16 Q. And it indicates that he's signed it as the
17 employee at the bottom?

18 A. Correct.

19 Q. What does this reflect in terms of hours served in
20 the month of January by George Maier?

21 A. He served 16 hours on the road.

22 Q. And it indicates eight hours, correct, on the 12th
23 and eight on the 13th?

24 A. That is correct.

25 Q. I was going to ask you, so go ahead and tell me

1 more detail. Let's say on January 12th, 2013,
2 what was Mr. Maier doing for the department?

3 A. For the sheriff's office, Mr. Maier was out
4 working 250 that day on the 12th. He was with
5 another one of our officers here, our deputies.
6 He was working basically traffic all day down on
7 250.

8 Q. And similarly, tell me what he was doing on
9 January 13th, please.

10 A. He was out patrolling the county. Our Sundays are
11 sometimes not so busy here. There was not much
12 traffic that day. He was out patrolling the
13 county as needed.

14 Q. So, again, the road patrol?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Was he serving by himself on that occasion?

17 A. Yes, on both occasions he was.

18 Q. I thought you mentioned on the 12th that he was
19 with another deputy.

20 A. Here. We had another deputy here. George went
21 out. He was out by his self.

22 Q. Next, Page 20 of Exhibit 1, can you identify that?

23 A. Yeah, that's the shrunk down version of our
24 appointment paper. That's filed with the clerk of
25 courts here in Harrison County. It shows that

1 George T. Maier was appointed and would be
2 appointed until the term ended on January 7th of
3 2017.

4 Q. Another document taken from your employment file?

5 A. That is correct.

6 Q. Is that also documentation that's fairly standard
7 for the appointment process of a deputy sheriff
8 with your office?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Next, Page 21 of Exhibit 1, what does that
11 indicate? Here, I believe, Sheriff, this document
12 actually consists of four pages.

13 A. This is what the officer has to provide to the
14 agencies when they are appointed to the
15 Harrison County Sheriff's Office. We go through
16 this and get the names and phone numbers and
17 addresses of what they are being appointed to.

18 I have to attest the first page. The
19 second page, or part 20, is actually where he
20 affirms the oath again, the oath of office that is
21 prescribed by the Ohio Peace Officer's Training.
22 He goes down and lists all his appointments
23 throughout his career on down through. Then he
24 also affirms that, signs off on that. This is
25 faxed in to OPOTA.

1 Q. Page 24 of the document is the fax transmission to
2 OPOTA; is that right?

3 A. That is correct.

4 Q. Another section of your employment file; is that
5 correct, too?

6 A. That is correct.

7 Q. On Page 21 of Exhibit 1, under "Appointment
8 Information," --

9 A. Okay.

10 Q. -- there are a series of boxes under Item 15. Do
11 you see that?

12 A. Uh-huh.

13 Q. In this instance, the box is marked full-time,
14 correct?

15 A. That is correct.

16 Q. Why, in this instance, was the box marked
17 full-time?

18 A. Because he was hired as a full-time deputy.

19 Q. If I understand it, that's consistent with what we
20 talked about earlier, that as far as you were
21 concerned, he was hired as a full-time deputy,
22 correct?

23 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.

24 Q. And he would be expected to serve 80 hours in
25 14-day periods?

- 1 MR. ROSENBERG: Objection. Leading.
- 2 A. That is correct.
- 3 Q. If we look back at Page 19 of Exhibit 1, are there
4 any other timecards for Mr. Maier's service here
5 with your office?
- 6 A. No.
- 7 Q. Since January 13th, 2013, has Mr. Maier been back
8 to actually serve on duty with your office?
- 9 A. No.
- 10 Q. Is Mr. Maier still considered a deputy sheriff
11 with the office?
- 12 A. No.
- 13 Q. What was the date of that termination or whatever
14 word you want to use that he was no longer
15 considered employed as a deputy sheriff?
- 16 A. As of February 5th I believe it was.
- 17 Q. Was there some documentation of that
18 termination?
- 19 A. Yeah, he sent me a letter to that effect of his
20 resignation. I don't know if it's in there or
21 not.
- 22 MR. HERVEY: I don't see one.
- 23 Q. I can tell you it's not part of Exhibit 1. As
24 long as you're indicating for the record --
- 25 A. Yeah.

1 Q. Did you receive some writing from Mr. Maier --

2 A. Yes, I did.

3 Q. -- effectuating his termination?

4 A. Yes, and I believe it was on the 5th of February.
5 On or about the 5th of February is when I received
6 that.

7 Q. Following your receipt of that, Sheriff Myers, did
8 you send any form of termination notice to OPOTA?

9 A. Yes. I want to correct that. It wasn't a
10 termination notice. It was a change of status.

11 Q. I don't believe that was provided and is not part
12 of Exhibit 1 either. What's the change of status?
13 Is that a form that's used?

14 A. Yes, same form as the -- it's the same form as
15 Page 21. If you check a new status, then you just
16 go in under the date of the appointment and change
17 what status change that he did.

18 Q. What was the change of status to?

19 A. We just changed it to special.

20 Q. Just a few additional pages of Exhibit 1 to look
21 at. As a group, you can turn to Page 25 through
22 31, if you would, please.

23 A. Okay.

24 Q. After you've had a chance to look at that, just
25 identify what those are.

1 A. That is our radio log or traffic log that comes in
2 to our dispatch. This is -- I'm assuming. I
3 shouldn't assume. This is the call log, dispatch
4 log of that day that George worked.

5 Q. If you look at the top of Page 25, you'll see
6 somebody wrote in "January 12th, 2013."

7 A. That was me, because what happens is when our --
8 when we print it, the day we print that off, no
9 matter what day we work it -- we have it in our
10 database or our server. It lists the date, but
11 when we print it, it will show 2/13 of 2013.

12 Q. Similarly, if you look at Page 29 of Exhibit 1,
13 you'll see the date written at the top?

14 A. Correct.

15 Q. Which was for the Sunday date that George was
16 here, correct?

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. Without belaboring it, is it the same thing that
19 you wrote that in --

20 A. Yes, I wrote that in so that you guys -- the
21 attorney, Mr. Beck, would have an idea of what two
22 days that he was here. Of course that printed
23 also on the 13th because I think it was a couple
24 days after his request came in.

25 Q. Did any of these calls on these pages reflect any

1 activity of Mr. Maier when he was in service as a
2 deputy sheriff?

3 A. Yeah, he -- there is on here -- said he was out
4 at -- I believe he came in about 12:38 on the 12th
5 from what this states.

6 Q. I don't want to interrupt you, but what page are
7 you looking at just so we can all --

8 A. Well, it's -- what page?

9 Q. Yes, please.

10 A. Yours is 26. I'm looking at Page 2. Yours
11 is 26.

12 Q. Thank you.

13 A. 12:38 is when he's signaled on. He was out at
14 Bessie's, which is a local diner down here, at
15 16:15. He was back 33 at about 16:36 is what it
16 says here. He was out at milepost four at 17:14
17 on Page 27.

18 Q. Thank you.

19 A. Just so you know.

20 MR. ROSENBERG: Sheriff, his number is
21 3415?

22 A. Yeah, his number is 3415, which it states that on
23 his ID card.

24 Q. I see that on Page 1 that that is his unit
25 number?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Basically what you're identifying is that unit
3 number, wherever it's recorded on these ledger
4 pages?

5 A. That is correct.

6 Q. Do you see any other -- I mean, we can look
7 through this ourselves, too, but do you see any
8 other indications of activity for Mr. Maier?

9 A. He was out there. 17:14 was the one where he was
10 at a traffic stop on 250, milepost four. He was
11 back 33 at 17:18, which means he's back in
12 service. Then he finished up about 20:20, 20:17
13 out at my residence, because he was using my car.

14 Q. That's what's indicated on Page 28. Do I
15 understand that?

16 A. That is correct. That is correct.

17 Q. I won't ask you to do the same thing, unless you
18 want to, for the next day. But essentially what
19 we would look for on Pages 29, 30, and 31 of those
20 logs is any reference to Mr. Maier's unit number,
21 correct?

22 A. That is correct.

23 Q. All right.

24 A. Now he did come out -- like I said, there wasn't
25 much traffic for him on the next day.

1 Q. In the content portion of the forms, what does 43
2 mean?

3 A. Home.

4 Q. Home?

5 A. Home or off the air.

6 Q. Off the air.

7 A. The 33 means in service.

8 Q. Well, the two entries in particular then would be
9 on Page 30, if I'm reading this accurately.
10 Mr. Maier indicated in service at 8:16, correct?

11 A. That's correct.

12 Q. And then on Page 31, he's out of service or home
13 at 16:10?

14 A. That's correct.

15 Q. Thank you. The final couple of pages. There's
16 only two more. Page 32 of Exhibit 1, can you
17 identify that for us?

18 A. Which number?

19 Q. I'm sorry. 32.

20 A. I was going to say.

21 Q. 32.

22 A. This is the letter that we have to produce on a
23 new hire. This is when you request all the
24 paperwork as well for the new hire.

25 Q. Is this a letter from you to the auditor --

1 A. Deputy auditor, that's correct.

2 Q. -- regarding Mr. Maier's appointment?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. And finally, 33, if you would wrap up and tell us
5 what that page is.

6 A. That is his payment earnings that he was paid for
7 his time here. That was his total gross that he
8 was paid while he was here.

9 Q. Does that memorialize his payment for the two days
10 that are reflected on his timecard?

11 A. That is correct.

12 Q. During the period of time that Mr. Maier was in
13 service on the two days that we've talked about,
14 did Mr. Maier have any supervisory
15 responsibilities?

16 A. No.

17 Q. Who was his direct supervisor at the time?

18 A. It's the oldest officer here, the oldest deputy,
19 or if there is a sergeant on duty. On Saturday,
20 it would have been the senior deputy, which is, by
21 the way, our policy. The same way would have been
22 on Sunday.

23 MR. MATHEWS: I don't have anything else
24 for you. I appreciate your time.

25

CROSS-EXAMINATION

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BY MR. ROSENBERG:

Q. Sheriff, I do have some questions. Do you need to take a minute or two?

A. No, you're fine.

Q. Sheriff, I am Tom Rosenberg, and I represent Sheriff Maier of Stark County. I want to go over a couple things that you said and then maybe touch on a few other issues. I think there was confusion, and go through your documents in order to help.

What was Sheriff Maier's originating appointment date as a deputy sheriff in Harrison County?

A. The original appointment date --

Q. Right.

A. -- would have been the 6th of January 2013.

Q. Then you indicated that the appointments traditionally end with the end of your term. That's why you referenced the January 7th, 2017 date?

A. That is correct. That's on the standard form that the BSSA gives us.

Q. You also talked a little bit about your background with Sheriff Maier. You said he was a post

1 commander here. Can you explain what you meant by
2 the phrase "post commander here"?

3 A. When George Maier was in the highway patrol, he
4 was assigned through the highway patrol as the,
5 when he got promoted, as the post commander down
6 at the Wintersville, Stoneville post of the
7 highway patrol, which he is the highest ranking
8 officer there in command at that highway patrol
9 post.

10 Q. In that role, why would the two of you interact?

11 A. For the longest time here, the highway patrol was
12 never really vigilant in what they did. George
13 came in with a new perspective on how to turn
14 offices and the patrol posts around. He gave a
15 lot of leadership to the young guys, a lot of
16 mentoring to young guys, and even the young
17 troops, and a lot of the old troops that was under
18 his command down there.

19 We seen -- in the years that George was
20 the post commander here at the highway patrol, we
21 hardly handled any crashes, because that's what
22 he -- he was a person that made the office that he
23 was assigned or the department or the post that he
24 was assigned do what they were supposed to do. We
25 got along with him very, very well. At the same

1 token, he was an exceptional person to work with
2 as far as law enforcement.

3 Q. After Mr. Maier had worked those two days, after
4 that, did there come a time when he told you that
5 he was going to run for sheriff of Stark County?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. From the time he told you he was going to run for
8 sheriff of Stark County, did you still consider
9 him a full deputy sheriff on your staff?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Once he told you he was going to run for sheriff
12 of Stark County, did he continue to put in any
13 hours?

14 A. No.

15 Q. How do you characterize the quality of the work he
16 did? Recognizing the short period of time, how
17 would you characterize it?

18 A. Like I said, George is a great mentor for my young
19 guys. He's seen it all. He's pretty much done it
20 all. With his years of experience in law
21 enforcement, both on the State side through the
22 assistant director position as public safety
23 director and the State of Ohio, and even through
24 the liquor side that he was involved with so much
25 as being the boss, he's well rounded in law

1 enforcement.

2 I can't think of anyone else I would want
3 to mentor my people here in what's coming this
4 way. I think that's the most important thing. I
5 mean, he is a person that can make things happen.
6 He makes it happen for the betterment of people
7 around him, whether it's a community, whether it's
8 a county, whether it's a PD, whether it's a
9 sheriff's department, whether it's a patrol post.
10 He just brings a light, for lack of a better term,
11 to the place in which he comes in.

12 I mean, he's just that bright light. I
13 mean, he's that jump-start that everybody needs.
14 Through the years, we've been friends. Yeah,
15 we've talked back and forth over the last, you
16 know, how many years it's been. I know the whole
17 family. He's just a great guy. I mean, he's just
18 happy all the time.

19 Q. Great. I'm going to ask you just a couple
20 questions. I'll try not to repeat things. In
21 Exhibit 1, I want to ask you a couple questions
22 about it.

20 on Mike DeWine Ohio Attorney General letterhead
21 dated January 6th, 2013. You said this was the
22 BCI investigation. Sheriff, I'll advise you that
23 in prior testimony, there's been some questions
24 about this agency ID, CUV578, and I'm pretty sure
25 you can tell us what that is.

1 A. Every agency that has a Webcheck is given a number
2 by the attorney general's office. That's our
3 identifier number.

4 Q. So CUV578 is the Harrison County Sheriff's Office
5 identifier?

6 A. That's correct.

7 Q. So we see that on the next page, too, with the
8 FBI --

9 A. That is correct.

10 Q. -- reference? Bates stamp Page 18, please. Now
11 this says, "Certificate of appointment in the
12 matter of appointment of George T. Maier as deputy
13 sheriff of Harrison County." It says,
14 "January 6th, 2013," correct?

15 A. That is correct.

16 Q. Then it says, "I do hereby appoint George T. Maier
17 as deputy sheriff for Harrison County, Ohio. Said
18 appointee is not a judge of a county court or
19 mayor." Is that your signature, Sheriff?

20 A. Yes, that is correct.

21 Q. Bates stamp Page 20. Again, this looks like a
22 commission appointment of Deputy Sheriff
23 George T. Maier, and it's signed on
24 January 6th, 2013. Is that your signature as
25 sheriff of Harrison County?

- 1 A. That is correct.
- 2 Q. That's an appointment of him as a deputy sheriff?
- 3 A. That is correct.
- 4 Q. The next one --
- 5 A. That's full-time deputy sheriff.
- 6 Q. Page 21, Bates stamp 21. You talked about this
7 before. You've referred to this as an OPOTA
8 document?
- 9 A. That's correct.

12 the terminology. So if you could, just remind us
13 what OPOTA stands for.

8 Q. It says, "Mr. Soos, please use this as
9 notification that the Harrison County Sheriff's
10 Office has hired a new full-time member of the
11 staff of the office. George T. Maier was hired
12 full-time as a deputy sheriff as of
13 January 6th, 2013 and started on the 12th of
14 January of 2013. I'm requesting all paperwork for
15 the new hire as well."

16 I read that correctly, didn't I, Sheriff?

17 A. Yes, you did.

18 Q. And it's signed by yourself?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. As the sheriff of Harrison County?

21 A. Yes, as the sheriff of Harrison County.

22 Q. People who are going to be reading this transcript
23 are located in Columbus. I think I know what you
24 meant, but you're going to need to explain a
25 little bit.

1 A. Okay.

2 Q. You said that he was working 250 on that day.

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. I don't think people reading this are going to
5 know what you meant by 250.

6 A. Nobody in Columbus knows where 250's at. It's the
7 worst road in the county. It's a U.S. route.
