



In Re Application of Reana Jackson (fka Allen) v. SaKeya MonCheree Stubbs
Claim Number 12-0038

This cause came on for hearing before the Board of Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund this 7th day of June 2013 on the application of Reana Jackson (fka Allen) alleging a loss in the amount of \$150, caused by dishonest conduct of an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Ohio

The Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund of Ohio find that:

- a) An attorney client relationship did exist between the claimant and SaKeya MonCheree Stubbs.
- b) The claimant suffered a loss of \$225 on or about January, 2010.

The Commissioners further find that the dishonest conduct consisted of theft of unearned fees, and that the following disciplinary proceedings were taken:

DISBARRED on 11/29/2012

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.

Therefore the Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund do hereby determine that the claim of Reana Jackson (fka Allen) is eligible for reimbursement in the amount of \$225.

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.
