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

CLAIM DETERMINATION ENTRY

In Re Application of Charles and Jean Baker v. Agatha Martin Williams
Claim Number 12-0092

This cause came on for hearing before the Board of Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund this **6th day of September 2013** on the application of Charles and Jean Baker alleging a loss in the amount of \$5,000, caused by dishonest conduct of an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Ohio

The Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund of Ohio find that:

- a) An attorney client relationship did exist between the claimant and Agatha Martin Williams.
- b) The claimant suffered a loss of \$2,733.33 on or about February 10, 2012.

The Commissioners further find that the dishonest conduct consisted of theft of fiduciary, and that the following disciplinary proceedings were taken:

Felony Suspension on 4/19/2012

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.

Therefore the Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund do hereby determine that the claim of Charles and Jean Baker is eligible for reimbursement in the amount of \$2,733.33.

Payment of said amount is conditioned upon claimant complying with the subrogation assignment and other requirements of Sec. 6 of GOV. Rule VIII of the Ohio Supreme Court.
