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

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**MOTION TO STRIKE BRIEFS OF AMICUS**


Now comes Appellant, Sudinia Johnson, through counsel and moves this Court enter an order striking the Amicus Brief filed by the Ohio Prosecuting Attorney Association and the brief filed by the Ohio Attorney General. Neither has restricted themselves to the Proposition of Law submitted to this Court and approved for briefing when Jurisdiction was granted.

Appellant filed a Memorandum in Support of Jurisdiction before this Court on December 16, 2013. The Memorandum proposed a single proposition of law related to the application of the Exclusionary Rule. This Court granted Jurisdiction on March 12, 2014. Both Appellant and Appellee have complied with the Rule of Practice which limit the issues to the proposition of law presented to this Court.

The Ohio Prosecuting Attorney Association and the Ohio Attorney General have each taken it upon themselves to address issues not presented to this Court and not approved for briefing by this Court. The remedy for failure to confine themselves to the authorized proposition of law is to strike the brief of each amicus. Alternatively, it is requested the unauthorized proposition in each brief be stricken. That would be

Proposition II for the Ohio Prosecuting Attorney Association and Proposition I for the Ohio Attorney General Amicus briefs.

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
