

CLAIM DETERMINATION ENTRY

In Re Application of Clyde and Carletta Pennington v. Marty Joel Stillpass
Claim Number 13-0111

This cause came on for hearing before the Board of Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund this 6th day of June, 2014 on the application of Clyde and Carletta Pennington alleging a loss in the amount of \$2,850, caused by dishonest conduct of an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Ohio

The Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund of Ohio find that:

- a) An attorney client relationship did exist between the claimant and Marty Joel Stillpass.
- b) The claimant suffered a loss of \$2,850 on or about January 2, 2013.

The Commissioners further find that the dishonest conduct consisted of theft of unearned fees, and that the following disciplinary proceedings were taken:

Resigned-Discipline Pending on 6/13/2012

The Commissioners further find that the claimant took affirmative action against the attorney within one year of becoming aware of the loss; and that there is no insurance or bond which will benefit the claimant; and that said claimant is not a spouse, close relative, partner, insurer or bonding company, nor a governmental unit.

Therefore the Commissioners of the Clients' Security Fund do hereby determine that the claim of Clyde and Carletta Pennington is eligible for reimbursement in the amount of \$2,850.

Payment of said amount is conditioned upon claimant complying with the subrogation assignment and other requirements of Sec. 6 of GOV. Rule VIII of the Ohio Supreme Court.
