#### NEWS

#### OHIO LEADS WAY: WITH FEWER YOUTH OFFENDERS, STATES SHUT JUVENILE PRISONS

Ohio is leading the way in reducing the number of children in prison. After struggling for years to treat young criminals in razor wire-ringed institutions, states across the nation are quietly shuttering dozens of reformatories amid plunging juvenile arrests, softer treatment policies and bleak budgets. For Ohio, the number of juvenile offenders has plummeted by nearly half over the last two years, pushing the state to close three facilities. California's closures include a youth institution near Los Angeles that operated for nearly 115 years. And one in Texas will finally go quiet after getting its start as a World War II-era training base. More...

#### SAVING MONEY, CHANGING LIVES

Judge Paul Herbert used to figure his job was to punish the doped-up, dead-eyed prostitutes who would stand - some, with great effort - in Franklin County Municipal Court to cop a plea and accept fines they couldn't pay anyway. These women are arrested repeatedly - one of them 36 times. They clog the court system and burden Franklin County's overcrowded jails, where the room rate is \$70 a night. More...

### JUDGE PAUL HERBERT SEEKS MORE EFFECTIVE WAY TO FIGHT PROSTITUTION

Serving on the bench at the Franklin County Municipal Court is like being a spectator at a parade of despair. Judges see the same crimes day in and day out, and their time on the bench can become a blur of sentencing the regulars who make the same bad choices over and over again. Judge Paul M. Herbert has resisted the cynicism that such a job brings. He showed initiative in starting the state's first prostitution court last year. The chance of failure was high, working with a population of women with serious drug and alcohol addictions. Many have been in jail multiple times, because they go right back to the streets, selling themselves to pay for their addictions. More...

# HOMES, NOT JAIL OR PRISON, ARE WHAT'S NEEDED FOR PEOPLE WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES

The study describes the shocking fact that there are now three times more mentally ill persons in American jails and prisons than there are in hospitals. In many urban areas, it's much worse. In California, it's about four times worse, in Florida, the figure is five times, and in Arizona, there are nine times more people with mental illness imprisoned than in psych wards. The human and financial implications of this worsening national trend are frightening. People with mental illnesses should have mental health treatment and a safe place to live instead of languishing in already overcrowded jails and prisons. Shockingly, in the end, it's the taxpayers that get stuck. In California alone, more than \$100,000 a year is spent to incarcerate a single person with mental illness. More...

**Deadline:** September 8, 2010

The National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), and the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) will fund research that will reduce the burden of suicidality (deaths, attempts, and ideation). Funding is intended to intensify investigator-initiated research on the topic, attract new investigators to the field, and increase interdisciplinary approaches to developing effective strategies to reduce suicidality. Mental disorders, along with alcohol use disorders (AUDs) and substance use disorders (SUDs), are of particular interest as they pertain to risk and protective factors and treatment efficacy and effectiveness for suicidality. Eligible applicants include public and private universities, nonprofits, for-profits, and state governments. The number and amount of grants to be awarded are contingent upon the availability of funds and the submission of a sufficient number of meritorious applications.
