This cause originated in this court on the filing of a complaint for a writ of mandamus involving an expedited election matter and was considered in a manner prescribed by law.

Upon consideration thereof, it is ordered by the court that the Hamilton County Board of Elections abused its discretion and disregarded applicable law in preparing and certifying ballot language stating that the use of two potential funding sources for the proposed affordable-housing trust fund would violate state law and a writ of mandamus is granted to compel the Hamilton County Board of Elections to prepare and certify new ballot language and transmit the language to Ohio Secretary of State Frank LaRose for the secretary's final approval, consistent with the opinion rendered herein.

It is further ordered that the writ is otherwise denied as to the Hamilton County Board of Elections and denied as to Cincinnati City Council and Ohio Secretary of State Frank LaRose.

Costs assessed to respondent, Hamilton County Board of Elections.
